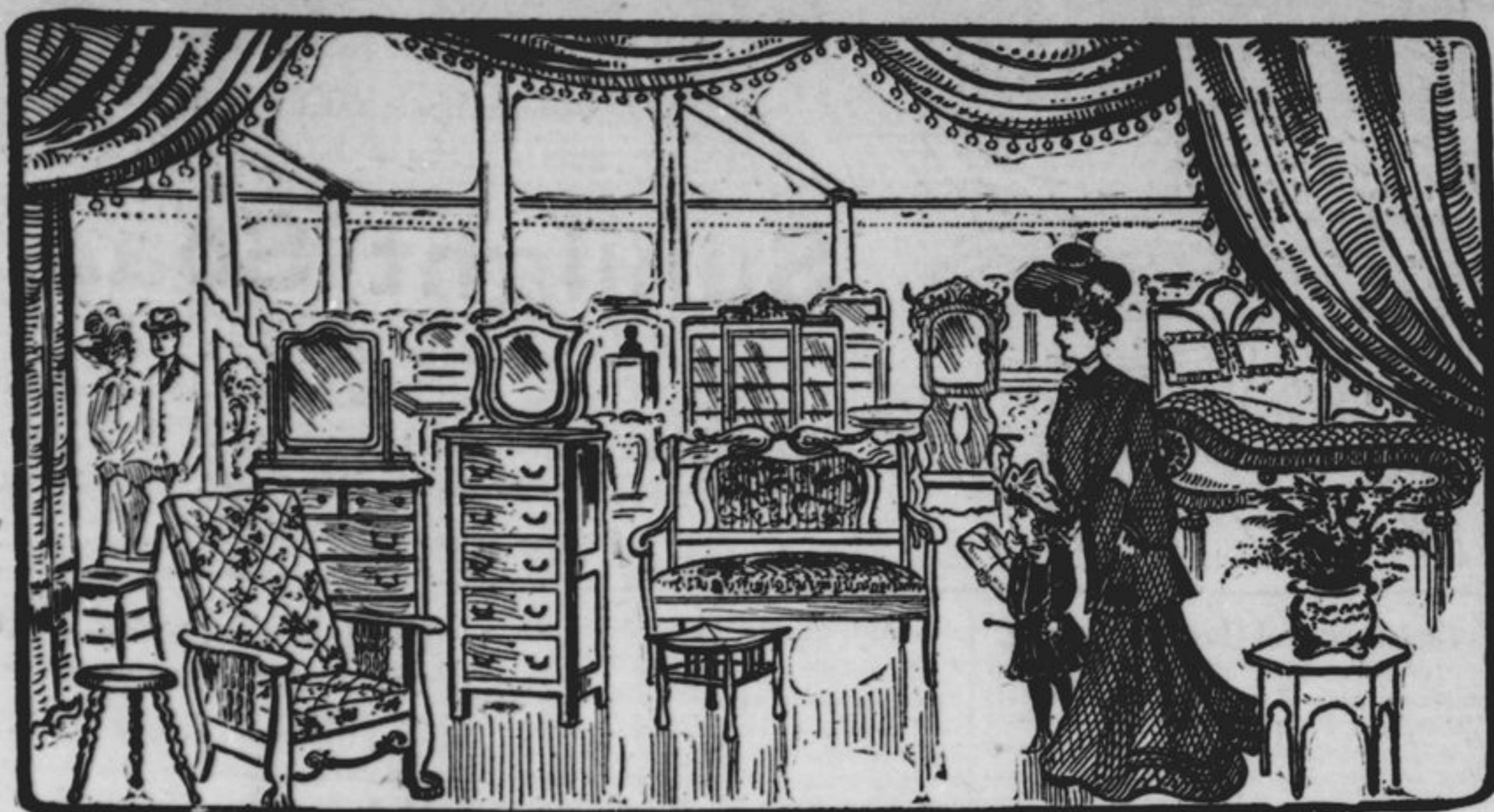

### Egremont Council

Council met May 29th, minutes sustained. Robb-Ferguson—That the Clerk be instructed to order six No 2 Box Scrapers from The Good Roads Machinery Co., Hamilton.—Carried. Ferguson—McArthur—That the Clerk be empowered to write to the Managers of the House of Refuge regarding refund of \$5 re committee of the late Geo. Wale. Holstein.—Carried. By-Law No 200, appointing Wm Hay Com., for Dromore passed usual readings, etc. The report that he had met the interested parties re water-gruance on Egremont and Proton town line and an agreement was arrived at under the ditches and Watercourse Act which was filed with the Clerk. McArthur—Robb—That the report be adopted and he receive \$1.50 Com. fees.—Carried. Ferguson—McArthur—That we now form a Court of Revision with the leave in the chair.—Carried. Members of Court subscribed to the required declarations. There were only two appeals, Adam Main assessed at \$4000.00, Ass't. sustained, Robert Christie, Holstein, assessed at \$1800.00, Business ass't, \$680.00, assessment on land reduced \$200.00. Business ass't reduced \$280.00; Entries on roll, John Jordan, tenant, Lot 12, Main St., West, Holstein, Henry McDougall Sr., owner, west 24, Cou 10. Philip-Ferguson—That the Court of Revision now close and the assessment Roll for 1906 as revised, do finally pass and Council business be resumed, and the Holstein Leader office be awarded the contract of printing the Voters' List.—Carried. Ferguson—Robb—That Mrs Muir be exempt from statute labor and land tax.—Carried. Robb—McArthur—That each Commissioner employ one of the following persons to operate the grader in his division viz: C E Smith, Jno McRobb, David McIntyre or Wm Aberdeen, at \$2 per day of 10 hours each.—Carried. Ferguson—Robb—That each Road Commissioner be allowed to spend \$200 on roads, bridges and culverts excepted.—Carried. Philip—Robb—That the Council empower the reeve and Engineer to sell the Debitures, let contracts and all business in connection with drains No 1, 2 and 3.—Carried. Robb—McArthur—That the Council instruct the reeve and clerk when distributing Pathmasters' bills to ask all Pathmasters to remove the rolling stone off the highway at least twice a year.—Carried. Resolved that the following accounts be paid: J H Brown goods, Mrs Barclay 4 months, \$4; Municipal World Debitures, \$2; do stationery, \$1.35; Clerk Post Cards, notices to Pathmasters \$80; D Porter, rep to Kirkness' bridge, \$150; O M Seina, printing, \$2.75; Alex Day, gravel, \$3.25; D McIntyre pt salary as Assessor, \$75; C A Drum, spikes, 50c. ### SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN WEST. HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS.

ANY even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta; excepting a and 26, not reserved, may be homesteaded by any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age to the extent of one quarter section of 160 acres more or less. Entry must be made personally at the local land office for the district in which the land is situated.

The homesteader is required to perform the conditions connected therewith under one of the following plans: 1. At least six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year for three years. 2. If the father (or mother, if the father is deceased) of the homesteader resides upon a farm in the vicinity of the land entered for the requirements as to residence may be satisfied by such person residing with the father or mother. 3. If the settler has his permanent residence upon farming land owned by him in the vicinity of his homestead, the requirements as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the said land.

Six months' notice in writing should be given to the Commissioner of Dominion Lands at Ottawa of intention to apply for patent. W. W. CORY.
