THE SPEED OF THE STARS

The announcement of the equipment of an expedition to Chile by the Lick Observatory of Mount Hamilton, Cal., for the purpose of ascertaining the orbital speed of stars situated at the southern celestial hemisphere, attracts popular attention to one of the most conspicuous achievements of advanced astronomical science.

The comparison of innumerable observations of stars positions made through many decades shows that nearly all the stars have a proper motion, although in the majority of instances the rate is infinitesimal. In such investigations the "new" astronomy, or astrophysics, has wrought wonders.

The image of a star produced by the object-glass of a great telescope is made to fall upon a very narrow slit in a metal plate, and the rays that pass through the slit are treated by a series of prisms, and are "dispersed" or spread out into a spectrum running from red to violet.

Blomer, of Buffalo, says that statistics regarding the insane of the United States in general show that each year there is a marked increase in the number of persons who become insane by the time the strawberry season is well under way, and that when the fruit disappears from the daily table the records of different asylums show that the number of cases decreases.

Following the disclosures of disgusting carelessness and criminality in meat packing in Chicago, which have stirred up Congress, come revelations of the means some of the packers take to get the unwholesome goods palmed off upon the public. New York is taking up the matter, and the Health Department is being urged to act.

"It contains a prescription called 'Bichardland,' advertised to harden 'That is, of course, paraffin, an absolutely indigestible substance. The catalogue also contains a list of preservatives and coloring fluids, dyes for both fresh meats and sausages and 'smoke colors,' so-called."

"Here is a big volume, the catalogue of the S. Birkenhead Company, of Milwaukee, which contains the same sort of stuff. Observe particularly 'Wagoner's disinfectant.' This is declared to be indispensable to every butcher. "Then here is a catalogue of the H. A. Born Company, of Chicago, entitled 'Secrets on the curing of meats.' Observe, for instance, the 'chicken loaf,' and 'by turned back again; but this time through a central opening in the great mirror; and the image of the star then falls up and is analyzed by a train of three prisms, the resulting spectrum being photographed by the attached camera.
