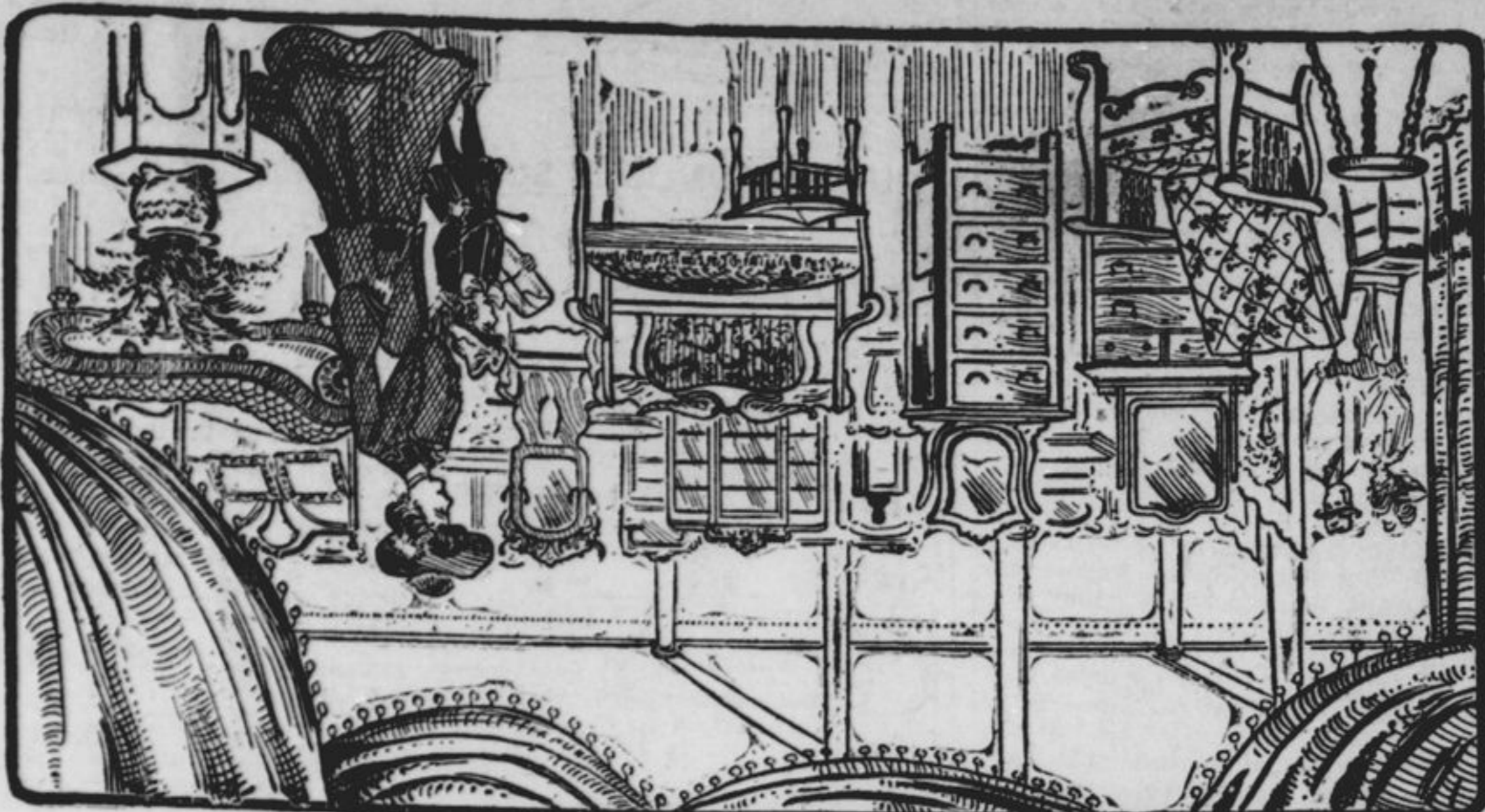

Editor "Review!"

There being so many Cream Separators through the country, perhaps a few hints as to the selection and care of the Cream Separator would not be out of place. After the farmer has decided to use a cream Separator he must look for one that is easily turned and cleaned, neither too high nor too low, built to last a long time, a clean skimmer and a reasonably cheap machine. Perhaps the better plan is to get one of these machines on trial and if it does not suit send it back. If this can not be done try all the machines possible in the Agent's warerooms before buying. Many people consider whether or not they would be wise in buying a separator. In some cases it would not be wise to get one because the farmer has only a few cows and has an ideal place to keep his milk. In other cases it would be in the best interests of the farmer to get a machine. A farmer who has a poor place to keep his milk would be money in pocket to get a Separator. It is not necessary to have a large number of cows before a Separator will pay. It will pay to buy a Separator with a few cows if there is not a good place to keep the milk. When purchasing a separator do not get one too small; time and money will be saved by getting a medium large size.

After purchasing the machine it requires great care. It needs to be cleaned and cleaned as often as it is used. Some agents, in order that they make a sale, will say that their machine needs washing only once a day or once in two days. If an agent tells you that, tell him you do not want his machine. A cream separator must be thoroughly cleaned every time it is used. Perhaps nothing is risked more by many generally and nothing will spoil more quickly and give off a more offensive odor than milk or cream. Have the Separator set level on a solid foundation. Do not put it in any place with offensive odors. It should be in a clean place near the hot water reservoir. Milk is in the best condition for separating immediately after milking but if it has to be held the best temperature is from 85 to 100 degrees F.

Many people cannot understand why the cream from the Separator does not always test the same. The richness of separator cream depends upon very many circumstances. For instance the faster the machine is turned and the slower the milk is fed into the machine the richer will be the cream or vice versa. The temperature and age of the milk also assist in clover skimming. Here again cleanliness pays an important part. If the separator bowl is dirty how can you get from it rich clean cream?

The separation of the cream from the skim milk by the use of the Separator or any other method depends upon the fact that the cream is lighter than the skim milk. When the milk enters the bowl of the machine it is sent whirling at a high rate of speed. This forces the skin milk to the outside of the bowl and the cream to the centre. The object of the devices which are inside the bowl is to break the milk into as fine divisions as possible, in order that a close separation may be secured. Suggestions for the Housewife

In Isabel Gordon Curtis's helpful paper entitled "The Progress of a Housewife," in the July issue of "The Review," she gives some useful hints as to how to make the best of vegetables. Root vegetables such as beets, turnips, carrots or parsnips, should be very clean and the tops cut away, you may be sure the market man has tried to freshen them. The smaller these vegetables are, the more tender. Parsnips and carrots require scraping, when they are young and tender. Turnips should be pared, while the skin of beets should not be broken or the tops cut more than two inches above the beet, otherwise they will lose color and sweetness.

When buying Lima Beans, choose green, juicy pods with small finely veined beans. Cook for one hour and a half in just enough boiling water to cover. Add salt when nearly done. Drain off part of the water, season with pepper, salt and butter, and send to the table piping hot. String beans are cooked the same way after being "trung and snapped."
