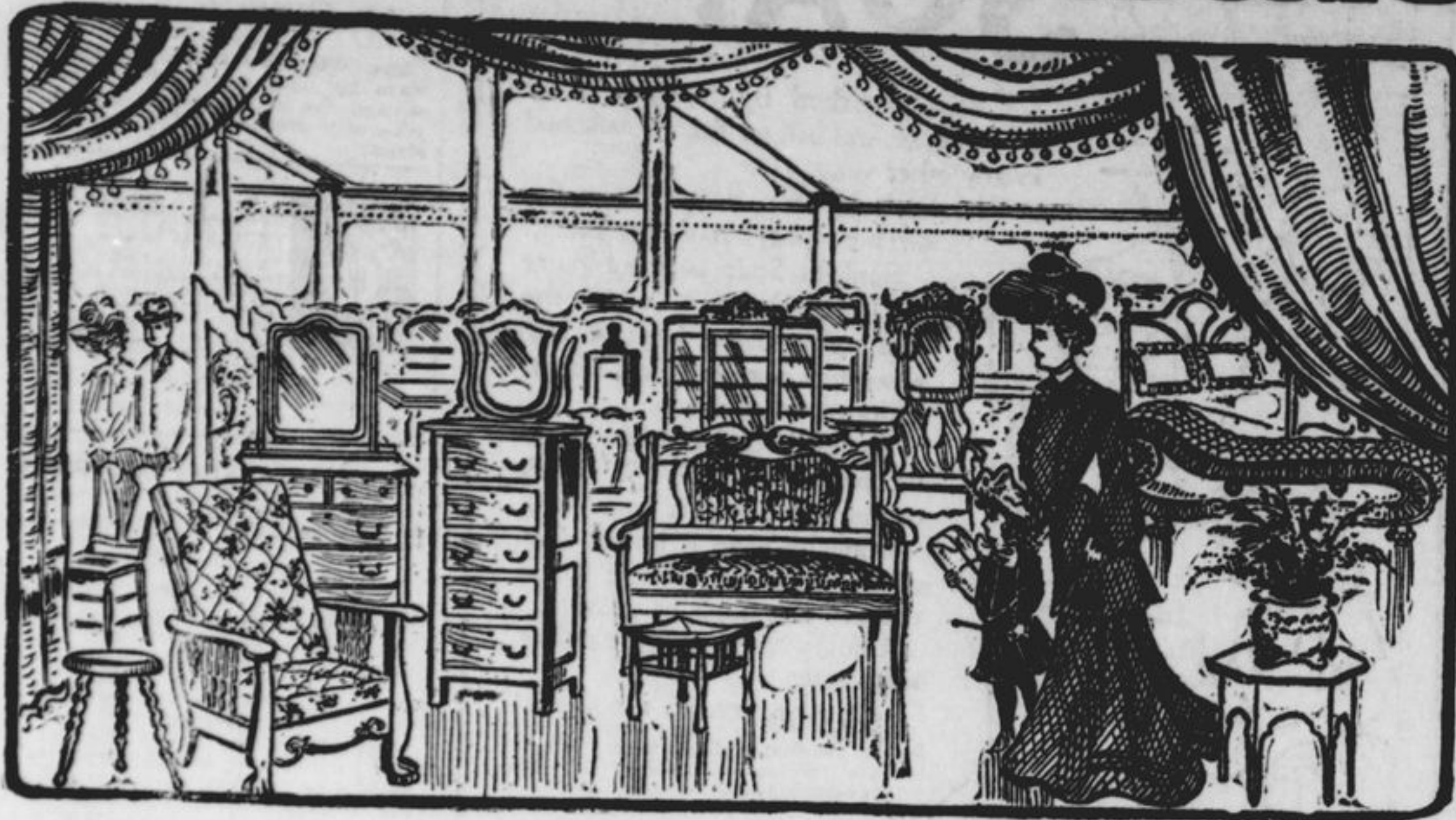

Egremont Council

Council met July 7th. minutes approved.

Robb—McArthur—Regarding A. Moyer's account against the late Geo Dale—this council takes no action—Carried.

Reeve reported on testing drains No 1, Egremont and Fretton to Wm Ellis at \$2 per rod, No 2 to do, at \$1.15 per rod, No 3 with branch to Jas Shea at \$1.65 per rod, contracts filed with clerk.

Robb—Ferguson—Report adopted and reeve receive \$9 for his services, and be charged to said drains—Carried.

Reeve reported on sale of drain debentures to Canada Life Assurance Co, Toronto, amount \$292.36, cash received \$2748 75 placed to Cr. of the municipality.

Ferguson—Robb—Report adopted and reeve receive \$12 expenses and charged equally to said drains—Carried.

Also on settlement with John McDonald on account of loss sustained by collapse of Mr Nair's bridge for \$280 the amount offered by Council, Receipts filed.

Robb—Philip—That Mr Traynor locate the road on base line Con 22 to town line—Carried.

Robb—Philip—That the reeve and Commissioner McArthur be a committee to examine bridge on both side road Con 14-15, and if dangerous to build anew—Carried.

Robb—McArthur—That a grant of \$30 be made to Com. Ferguson for cutting hill at Lot 2, Con 22, said grant to be repaid from commutation tax due said beat—Carried.

Philip McArthur—That a grant of \$50 be made to supplement that of Arthur township and Co Wellington of \$100 to improve townline between McDonald's hill and Conn—Carried.

Comr. McArthur reported on road jobs travelling by day's labor, lot 55 Con 12 amounting to \$27.00, F Jordan, travelling 52 rods 5th sideline, Con 12-13, \$36.40, do rep culvert Lot 5, Con 12, \$9.25, W Horsburg drawing tile and putting in culvert etc, Lot 5, Con 12, \$8.90, W Reid rep. culvert Lot 5, Con 11, \$8.90 do drawing tile and putting in culvert under Mitchell's bridge \$9.50, W Grant, straightening road Lot 7, Con 12, \$4.00.

Ferguson—Philip—Reports adopted and Comr get \$5 fees—Carried.

Ferguson—Robb—That we grant \$50 to be expended on Proton and Egremont townline—Carried.

Ferguson McArthur—Respecting communication from Mr Thos Davis, License Inspector, that this Council take no action at present—Carried.

McArthur—Hastie—That Comr Philip be appointed Inspector on drains No 1 and 2 and Comr, Robb Inspector on No 3—Carried.

By-Law No. 199 to issue debentures for Holstein sidewalk was declared carried and was read a third time and signed etc. The debentures were also signed and a By-Law was passed to commute the statute labor in Holstein to 25c per day.

Reeve's report on road improvements, Jas Eccles 3 1/2 rods gravelling at 60c, Lot 4 and 21, Con 19, \$27.25 do gravel for foreroad \$5.50; do, road improvements Lot 15 and 16, Con 17, \$1.50; Geo Lothian, pathmaster for gravelling, Lot 14, Con 19 and 20, \$32.00; Geo McWilliams, Pathmaster, labor 2 days \$2.00; Thos Reid, Pathmaster gravelling lots 10 and 11 Con 15, \$46.00.

Ferguson—McArthur—Report adopted, Comr fees, \$900—Carried.

Comr Robb, road improvements, S Kobb drawing tile and putting in culvert, Lot 4, Con 3, \$5.75; A. McIntyre tile culvert, Lot 5, Con 9, \$4.00; D Hunter large culvert and rep roadway, \$12; J T McBride underbrushing roadway Lot 6, Con 7 and 8, \$5.25; S E Smith operating grader 9 days \$18.00 oil and rep's 60c.

Philip—McArthur—Report adopted, Comr fees \$3.00—Carried.

Comr Philip road improvements on Con 5 amount expended \$70.50, fees \$5 Con 9 expended \$26.10, fees \$3.00, Con 10 expended \$32, fees \$1.50 and Comr McKenzie Proton reported a culvert on Proton and Egremont townline cost \$8.25 Egremont share \$1.75, O Ross timber bought \$1.00, do Dr to old timber bought \$1.00.

McArthur—Robb—Report adopted, Comr fees \$7.50—Carried.

Comr Ferguson road improvements in O S R amounting to \$14.00, day's work on hill G A Con 16, amounting to \$41.97, Day's work on hill Lot 15 Con 3, amounting to \$20.50.

McArthur—Philip—Report adopted, Comr fees and overseer \$10—Carried.

Gravel accounts were paid amounting to \$84.98 and other accounts amounting to \$395.47 were paid.

Council adjourned to meet on Sept 22nd to lay the rates and general business unless sooner called by the reeve.

Artemesia Council

Artemesia Council met in the town hall on Saturday, July 7. Members all present, the reeve in the chair. Minutes of previous session read and comment and I was out of bed, the window open ready to jump out if the inside began to fall and I stood there for what seemed a very long time before it began to slow up, not a brick fell, not even a crack in it. The river raised 6 or 7 feet and splashed as if a swift boat had worked up the water; all was quiet in a minute as if nothing had happened but the sensation is awful, it makes some people sick at the stomach.
