

### A MODEL PRISONER.

Never Broke Prison Rule in 25 Years' Confinement.

Albany, N. Y., Sept. 24.—Governor Higgins to-day announced that he had granted an application for pardon in the case of Guiseppi Guidici, convicted of murder in King's county, and sentenced to death in November, 1885.

Former Governor Hill commuted Guidici's sentence to life imprisonment the following year, and subsequently tender further commutation to 40 years. During his confinement of nearly a quarter of a century Guidici had never broken a single rule of the prison.
