It is no small tribute to the winter leges. It is no small tribute to the press that all these authorities on education should make their appeal to the newspapers down town, rather than to each other, for they write our than to each other, for they write our text-books, they control our institutions of learning, and if the editors and reporters mis-spell the words they write, these are the men who misled them, mistaught them, hammered error into them when they were young and helpless, and would have taken to "fonetik speln" with eagerness.
