Industrial Home Notes

Death of Mrs Saunders

On Saturday 13th inst., this old lady well known in Durham and neighborhood passed away at the House of Refuge in Markdale. Mr Gies, the clever literary inmate, writes to the eastern papers as follows:

The deceased lady was a native of England and came to Canada when young. She attained the venerable age of 89 years and had been three times married, her last husband having predeceased her several years ago. She was one of the first inmates admitted to the home having been here two years and nine months and was the last survivor of three female inmates of the home when your car was admitted.

She was a life-long and staunch adherent of the Methodist Church of which she was a true and consistent member. She frequently led in prayer at our divine service on Sabbath afternoons, her prayers in her native vernacular were the essence of simple piety; she was always the first to rise to her feet in our afternoon meetings to testify for her Lord, and her testimonies rendered in her simple unadorned manner, were so full of godliness and love to others and thankfulness for the home provided for her that she could not fail to exert a powerful influence on the minds of her hearers that she had the life of a true and faithful follower of Christ, not only in word but in every day actions which were a tangible proof of her Sunday profession. She gained many friends among the people of Markdale who swell the congregation in our service room each Sabbath she also led family prayers each morning and evening at the women's end of the house.

She expressed in her testimony the Sunday before her death that it may be that she would not see us on earth but prayed to God that we should all meet again in Heaven. We understand that she was only two or three days confined to her bed and died at the time above stated in the arms of the matron who was holding her up in bed to prevent suffocation. She was conscious to the last, her end was peaceful. She will be greatly missed.

She was for a number of years a well-known resident of Durham, but whether or not she leaves any family connections I cannot say. When admitted she brought her own clothes with her and requested the matron to put nothing colored on her at her death, she desired to be buried pure white and, as a result, her desire was fulfilled.

Have You Burned Your Ashes?

Last Friday we made a small experiment in burning our waste, with a quantity of ashes and coal and found it burned all right, though we had no means of testing the heat. Same day the Globe came out with a column article relating the experience of their day engineer, Cass Kinsey, who, rather unbelievably and to the quiet, mixed four bushels of ashes, ready for the garbage man, with one bushel of coal and moistened it with a half gallon of water, in which he had dissolved a couple of handfuls of salt. This was shoveled into the furnace and "Charlie" and his assistant watched the result. Watching the steam gauge, closely they had their doubts remove for the head began to waver and moved on to a higher figure, then even higher. Ashes had not only burned, but ceased more so than the coal alone!

Mr. James Ireland went down to the McIntyre furnace to experiment and was satisfied. Mr. Darling and others have tried it, and no doubt they should the coal-burning world at large there are experimenters innumerable testing the Attoona cobbler's process.

If coal can be made perfectly combustible, it will work a revolution in the Northern hemisphere, in essence, the fuel expense. That it will stimulate industry seems also certain, and will cause a wider demand for salt and oxalic acid. In the tests we have mentioned simply salt and water was applied.

When seen three hours later Mr Kinsey stated that he had added to more fuel, whereas on other days he had to throw in more coal every half hour. No mathematical calculations had been used in measuring the mixture, neither had they added any oxalic acid.

The cobbler, who for long years had striven to solve the problem, and who succeeded at last, might have become a millionaire, but some one opened the bag and the cat is out. All the world burn ashes now, or soon will.

It was yesterday that Toronto found out and commenced to experiment. The street cars that should have been crowded at 8.30 and 9.30 in the morning went down town only half filled.

The office boy in the inmost recesses of his brain was figuring dimly what excuse to make for being late, as down in the chilly cellar he shoveled and mixed and mixed and shoveled the new fuel. The shabby, time-worn old bookkeeper in the dry goods house grew reckless with passion for scientific research, and took the kitchen scale and a shovel and a dishpan and some water and the salt dish and experimented.

Ashes for Fuel.

Not once or twice in the world's history has great discoveries been made by accident. The discovery by John Ellmore, an Altoona, Pa., cobbler, that ashes can be converted into fuel, seems to belong to that class. He took out patents for his secret, but apparently his secret has leaked out, for it is reported that manufacturing establishments are cutting their coal bills in half, and pavement layers who used to get all the ashes they wanted for foundations for nothing are short in their supply. The formula is:

Moisten with either salt water or salt water in which oxalic acid has been dissolved, a mixture containing one part coal and three parts ashes, and a better fuel than pure coal is obtained. The ashes of anthracite coal burn as readily as do those of bituminous coal. This mixture will, upon being placed upon a burning fire, fuse into a coke-like mass and deposit but little residue. The salt water may be obtained by the dissolution of common salt in water.

As has often occurred before, the (1) man is likely to be little benefited by his discovery.

Synopsis of Canadian North-West HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS

Any vacant unreserved section of Dominion lands in Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta, excepting 8 and 20, not reserved, may be homesteaded by any person who is not sole head of a family, or a male over 18 years of age; to the extent of one-quarter section of 160 acres, more or less. Entry must be made by or on behalf of the Local Land Office for the district in which the land is situated. The homesteader is required to perform the conditions contained hereunder under one of the following plans: 1. At least six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year for three years. 2. If the father or mother, if the father is deceased, or the homesteader resides upon the land in the vicinity of the land entered for, the requirements as to residence may be satisfied by such person residing with the father or mother. 3. If the settler has his permanent residence elsewhere and is not the owner of the land, the requirements as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the said land. Six months' notice in writing should be given to the Commissioner of Dominion Lands at Ottawa of intention to apply for patent. N.B.—Quarterly publication of this advertisement will be paid for.
