The owner of an inferior stallion, in nine cases out of ten, will not allow his horse to stand in the stable and call the money he invested in him dead loss. Rather than this he will send him out to do service at a reduced fee; and he will keep on reducing it until it is quite impossible for anyone to bring in a good kind of stallion to compete against bim. The stotch premium system of hiring a good stallion for the season to a company which guarantees a certain number of mares has the happiest results in that country. Its introduc tion here has more than once been commended, the greatest difficulty to overcome, seemingly being the opposition of private stallion owners themselves.
