But that the flavor and color of Ontario flour is superior must be conceded even by those most interested in pushing the product of the prairie provinces. Down East. in the Maritime Provinces, the demand for a first-class flour has led to the Ontario public opinion in favor of sewheats in such proportions that enough gluten is added to the Ontario product to bring it up to the strength of western flour, while retaining the little returned to the place of producdelicate and tasty qualities for which Ontario flour is famous.
