Egremont Council

Council met May 28th, minutes confirmed. Comr. McArthur reported rep. bridge. Lot 7, Con 6, cost \$2.60 by Jas Morrison.

Lutlian—Ferguson—Report adopted, Com. fees 50 cts.—Carried. Receive reported that he had settled account in course of sending the late Geo Dale to Court of Refuge, Am't received, \$10.00, which was paid into treasury.

Ferguson—Lutlian—Report adopted.

Ferguson—McArthur—That each Com'r employ his own grader operator—Carried.

Ferguson—Philip—That \$250 be set apart for each road Com'r, for general repairs of the roads, not including culverts and bridges.—Carried.

Several complaints were made respecting a pile of garbage on the side of the Public Highway, just outside of the limits of Holstein, Resolved—That no rubbish or anything that may become a nuisance to the travelling public be placed upon, or alongside of the highway. This being in direct contravention to the Tp. By-laws, and the parties depositing the same are personally responsible for any accident resulting therefrom, and the Pathmasters see that the same is removed.—Carried.

Philip—Ferguson—That Com'r Lutlian accompanied by the reeve be instructed to settle Mr Watson's water grievance at Lot 27, con 14.—Carried.

McArthur—Lutlian—That this council now form itself into a Court of Revision, on the Ass't Roll for 1907, with the Reeve in the chair.—Carried.
