Sir Wilfrid's Return.

From all indications a great reception will be given the Premier, upon his return to Canada from attending the Colonial Conference in London. From the time the Premier sets foot on Canadian soil until he arrives at Ottawa, he will be the recipient of royal tokens of the esteem in which he is held by Canadians, without regard to party.

As a consequence of the Premier's visit to England, Canada has become better known, and her aspirations better understood. Trade relations between this and other countries have been improved, all of which will redound to the advantage of the Dominion as long as all will participate in the results.

With the completion of the Grand Trunk Pacific, the Georgian Bay Canal and the inauguration of the Red River Route, Canada will have made large strides in the fulfilment of her destiny, and the people will have abundant cause to bless Sir Wilfrid Laurier and the Liberal party, a party which has been well described as the party of progress.

The Reeve reported that he met the Reeve and clerk, Arthur up, and settled accounts of S. labor and grants on the townline for 1906-07, Egremont expended \$351.90, Arthur \$265.44, Bunston \$297.40 to be spent on T. L. this season. Ferguson - Lothian - Report adopted, com'r fees \$8.00. - Carried.

Com'r Lothian and the Reeve - Committee appointed to examine and report upon the water grievance, lot 47, con 14, report that they had examined locality and recommended that council take no action, and await developments. Ferguson - Philip - Report adopted, Com fees \$1.50, Jno A. Swanson and W. J. Sharp were appointed auditors under By-Law 218, to make a special audit from Jan 1st to June 29th, inst.

Lothian - McArthur - That the payment of orders of P. village, trustees, amounting to \$7.75 be confirmed. - Carried.

Com'r Ferguson reported - That Reid gravelling 68 rods, lot 10 con 18, cost \$22.50, Cornish ditch and two culverts, lot 16 in 16 respectively, lot 3 of 12 con 1 cost \$15.00, also do culvert, Orchardville, 11 pieces 10 in, \$5.00, Normanby half cost, also grader work G. A., Con 14, 12.00, do lot 15, con 14, cost \$6.00; H. Reid use of wheeled scraper \$1.00.

Porter, filling roadway, lot 10, con 5, \$39.00; Geo. Ekott, rep. bridge lot 26, con 12, \$18.00, do gravelling lot 11, con 12, \$27.00; D. Porter, gravelling Lot 10, con 6, \$6.00; A. Reeve reported rebuilding and repairing culvert lot 27, con 4, Egt and Arthur I line by J. P. Bolger \$5.00. Lothian - Philip - Report adopted, Com fees \$1.00. - Carried.

By-law, No 212 to appoint a Tp. treasurer, passed the usual readings. The name of John A. Swanson was inserted in the By-Law, salary \$100 per year. McArthur - Lothian - That the clerk be instructed to take an inventory of the documents and supplies in the treasurer's possession, and examine the new treasurer's sureties, and report at next meeting. Carried.
