

daughter, brother or sister of an intending home

The homesteader is required to perform the homestead conditions under one of the follow 1. At least six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year for three

2. If the father (or mother, if the father is deceased) of the homesteader resides upon a farm in the vicinity of the land entered for, the requirements as to residence may be satisfied by such person residing with the father or 3. If the settler has his permanent residence upon farming land owned by him in the vi-

Six months' notice in writing should be given to the Commissioner of Dominion lands at Ottawa of intention to apply for patent.
