Toronto News Attacks Sir Wilfred.

Everybody Come to South Grey Fall Show, September 24 and 25.

The Toronto News in an editorial in its issue of the 5th inst, again attacks Sir Wilfrid Laurier on the School clauses of the Autonomy Bills and treats us to a rehash of the old arguments and contentions that were used to inflame and arouse, for political purposes, the electers of On-tario, at a time when the people of the western provinces, who were the persons interested and the persons who had knowledge of all the circumstances in connection with the case, refused to be agitated and shewed, in the most unmistakable manner, that they were quite satisfied to have perpetuated the legislation that had been of their own framing and had for so many years proved very satisfactory to all concerned whether Protestant or Catholic.

The Toronto Telegram, though fairer and not so bitterly partisan as the News, is also a Conservative paper, edited by Mr John Ross Robertson, a much respected member of the Orange Society and a Conservative ex-member of the Canadian House of Commons, and it may be seen from the following editorial, which we clip in full from the Telegram of the 3rd inst, that the denun ciations of that paper are not all for Sir Wilfrid Laurier but that Mr Borden receives a fair share :


