#### Glengly Council.

The newly elected Council for the Township of Glengly met January 13 as per statute. Members present, Thos. McFadden, Esq., Reeve, E. W. Hunt, Thos. Nichol, J. A. McMillan and Wm. Weir, Councillors. Each member made and subscribed to the Statutory Declaration of Qualification and of office and took their seats, the Reeve in the chair. Minutes of last meeting read and confirmed.

Communications read as follows: from the Clerk's statement of votes given for each candidate and the account for the election; from Jno Kelly, statement of Municipal funds in bank on 31st December as 1905,05; from Dr Ego, Treasurer of Markdale school receipt for school money.

By-Laws 483, auditors, 484, Health Officers and 485 Assessor was introduced and read a first and second time. McMillan-Hunt-That election expenses \$59.15 be paid. Carried.

Hunt-Nichol-That the Reeve and Wm Weir be a committee to enquire into sufficiency of the security given by the Treasurer.

Hunt-Weir-By-Law 483 appointing R T Edwards and W J Hitehis as auditors was read a third time and passed. Hunt-Nichol-By-Law 484, appointing R J Torry and Alexander McLachlin as members of Local Board of Health and Dr Hutton as M H O was passed.

McMillan-Nichol-By-Law 485 appointing J A McDonald as assessor at \$70 was passed. Hunt-Nichol-That \$5 each be granted to Sick Children's Hospital and National Sanitarium Association. Carried.

Hunt-Nichol-The Reeve and Treasurer was paid \$2 each for preparing financial statement. McMillan-Nichol-The Clerk was paid \$40 on salary.

Weir-McMillan-The Clerk was instructed to order 7 copies of the Municipal World for Council. Ward Commissioners were appointed as follows: Ward 1 Weir, ward 2 McMillan, ward 3 Nichol, ward 4 Hunt, the Reeve.

Next meeting February 15, to a m. J. S. Black, Clerk.

How to Secure Farm Help. S. A. Scheme of Immigration.

During the past four years The Salvation Army has succeeded in bringing to Canada a good class of Farm labourers and Domestic Servants.

Notwithstanding the protest made in some sections of the country, that there is a surplus of labour, the Army Officials find there is still a great demand for agricultural labourers and they have found it necessary to charter several Ocean Liners to supply the need.

The call for farm labourers, comes from all parts of the Dominion and now that the Ontario Government has decided not to continue supplying farm help, and as it is likely that immigration to Canada will not commence until late in April, the demand for settlers coming out under The Army auspices will be very great.

The first chartered ship will be the " Kensington," sailing from Liverpool, February 20th, for British Columbia points, followed by the "Southwark," on March 5th, for Ontario points; the "Lionian" from Glasgow, and the " Kensington," from Liverpool, on March 25th.

Farmers who have not made application for help for the coming season, are advised to write for Application Forms and further particulars to Lieut.-Colonel Howell, 20 Albert St., Toronto, Ont. The class of immigrants supplied by The Army has given good satisfaction throughout the country, and the experience they have had in the past years in this direction, will evidently qualify them for selecting suitable farm help this season.

Farmers and Stockraisers benefit by Blended Flour from Ontario Wheat.

All this aside, however, there is a healthy demand for Ontario wheat. The blended flours are meeting with the most gratifying success. The sales for each month, as reported by the leading mills, show a big increase over the corresponding month of the previous year. This increased demand for blended flours means an increased demand for Ontario wheat. Farmers who keep abreast of the times know about these blended flours, are using them, and are planting Ontario wheat for the advancing market.

It is a great pity that every farmer in our province does not realize the importance of making these blended flours a success. And every farmer can help in this great work simply by buying blended flours whenever the "flour barrel is empty." The farmers themselves will benefit by getting more money for their wheat. Stockmen and dairymen will share in the profits by paying less for bran and shorts. As is well known, the reason these feedstuffs cost so much now is because our best mills do not grind as much grain as they should, and consequently have not the bran, etc to sell.

And finally, the whole province will benefit because higher wages for wheat means more money for everybody.

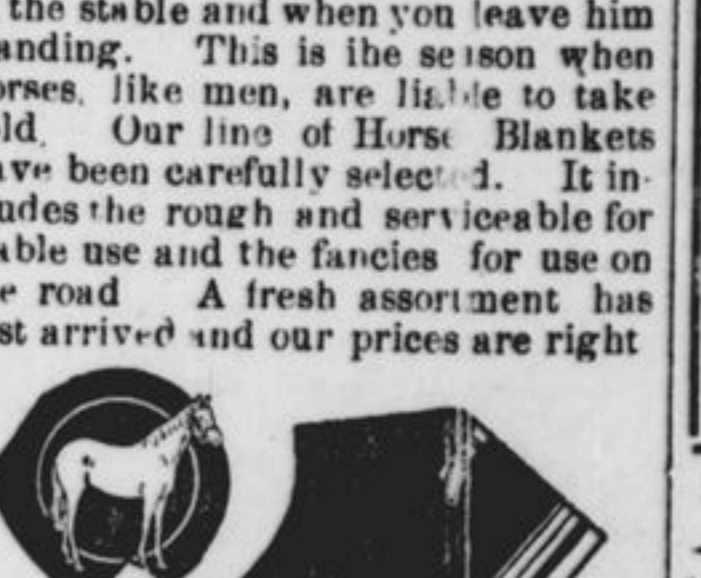
