Hopeville

On Sunday 5th the Rev. Mr. McInnes went to Palmerston to preach with the consent of Presbytery. Mr. Brethour Mt Forest, filled the pulpit here in the Epiphany Church.

We do have some funny things done here at our village but one that has just come to light beats near all of them. One of the suburbs of our village is called Beer Street and a farmer there being scarce of straw for horse and cattle bedding, took his team and hired man to saw mill to draw home saw dust for bedding. They procured a second sleigh. When they had one sleigh box full his man drove it home and the farmer stayed and filled the other with the best saw dust he could get. When it was well filled he went to wait till his team would return. In the meantime another farmer's team came for saw dust and in the sleigh were some gay young fellows. The young man had to turn his horse around and he went away as quickly as he came after being told to leave his premises and never come on them again, after getting called a lot of bad names. This was paying him with his own coin.

The frosty weather here lately has lowered the water in the Maidland River that the people can travel across at the Proton and Egremont bridge, the new bridge, on the 12th sideroad bridge, and at the 37th side road, near Melancthon. The banks at townline Cedarville keep the water within the bounds but up in the township it will be half a mile wide in places yet. This large tract of land being flooded every year is a great drawback to Proton and we believe that last year, Reeve McArdle made a good explanation at the County Council's June Session as to a remedy.
