From the former the principal may by his own say-so without any examination, pass candidates into the Normal schools in the all-important elementary subjects of reading, writing, spelling, arithmetic, book-keeping and business papers, art, biology, geopraphy, English grammar and mensuration. But, sir, he must pass a departmental examination in algebra, geometry, physics, chemistry, with Latin as a bonus.
Why this distinction? If it is desirable to wipe out examinations, why retain them in these latter subjects? Why place the less important subjects on a higher plane than those all-important elementary subjects. (Cheers)
