Artemesia Council. The Artemesia township Council met in the town hall, Flesherton, on Saturday, May 9, 1908. The following communications were read viz., Report of the Reeve and Mr Wright re the request of the Cataract Power Company to divert the Beaver across the Valley road on lot 23, con. 9, recommending that no immediate action be taken in the matter; the Clerk of Markdale account for the use of hall of Division Court purposes for 1907, \$6.00; J. C. Neilson and others, petition, protesting against the enlargement of school grounds at Proton Station, as there was no request to the council in the matter, the same was laid over.

McKenzie—Carson—That By-Law 681 to permit the Cataract Power Co. to place poles on highways be read a second time—Carried. Wright—Carson—That Mr. McKenzie is hereby authorized to investigate the complaint of Mrs. Carr in reference to obstructions on Canrobert street, Eugenia, and report to this Council at its next meeting—Carried. McKenzie—Best—That the Reeve be paid \$4.00 for committee work re James Campbell, and re Cataract Power Co., and Mr. Wright be paid \$2.00 services on committee re Cataract Power Co.—Carried. Best—Carson—That \$100.00 be granted to be expended on Valley road, south from concession 10 to Loucks mill, and the Reeve attend to the expending of the same—Carried. Wright—Best—That J. & W. Boyd's account for coal oil for town hall, 50c, be paid—Carried. McKenzie—Best—That R. Cook be paid \$2.50 for taking inmate to the House of Refuge—Carried. McKenzie—Carson—That the matter complained of by John S. Corbett, as to

necessity of a drain on part of town line Artemesia and Proton be referred to Mr. Best—Carried.

Carson—McKenzie—That the account of the village of Markdale, \$6.00, for rent of Division Court room for 1907 be paid—Carried.

McKenzie—Carson—That the report of the committee appointed to enquire into the advisability of granting right to Cataract Power Company of diverting the Beaver river over the Valley road at lot 23, con. 10, be received and adopted—Carried.
