A Call to Liberalism.

The Toronto Globe issues a call to the Liberal party, in which it urges allegiance to the principles of Liberalism in the coming Provincial contest and the support of the candidates of the party by all of its adherents. The Globe, in this connection, says:—
The Provincial general elections are in sight, and it is the duty of the Liberals of Ontario to see to it that Liberalism will be more largely and more strongly represented in the new Provincial parliament than in the one now about to be dissolved. That is a duty owed to citizenship in the province and to the principles for which all true Liberals stand. No intelligent man is at liberty to neglect or to misuse his responsibility as a free citizen. If he is true to his rights of citizenship in Canada he will give intelligent consideration and earnest service to the doing of his share in the government of his country. And not the least part of his responsibility is for the election to parliament of men who will represent and help to make dominant the views for which he stands.

Commenting on this call the Brantford Expositor says that the times are not without their opportunities for a larger service of the country's need by a wider application of the principles of Liberalism. The call of the Globe is well timed and embracing the traditional principles of the party all Liberals should rally to its support, thus ensuring the return to the legislature of representatives who will be worthy of the trust reposed in them and aggressive in furthering the interests of the province which it will be their privilege to serve.

Tribute to German Canadians.

A recent issue of The Standard has Mr. H. H. Miller's speech on the immigration policy of the government. He supported the policy of the government and expressed the opinion that with hundreds of thousands of fertile acres in the west, unoccupied, unproductive, Canada required a large number of immigrants but these should be of the best.
He traced the early history of German settlements in Ontario, and paid a high tribute to the desirability of German-Canadians as settlers. He

said they were thrifty, industrious and sober, good farmers, and made excellent citizens. He referred to a number of prosperous manufacturing centres in Ontario, which owed their prominence and prosperity to Germans, who, from small beginnings had succeeded in establishing large manufacturing enterprises, employing much labor and capital. Mr. Miller's address was upon entirely new lines and conveyed much information to the House that was entirely new.
Mr. Miller's contributions to all the debates have been admirable in spirit and full in information. He is constantly at his post and the example of good service he is showing as a parliamentary representative is a pride to all his constituents. Reform and Conservative alike.

TOPICS OF THE WEEK

—The next Provincial Legislature will consist of 106 members. This is eight more than the last house, the extras being four more in Toronto and four in New Ontario.

—The latest big tangle between the parties at Ottawa is over the "Elections Bill," which Conservatives claim is an attempt to hurt them in Manitoba, British Columbia and possibly other places. The Liberals claim that the Provincial lists in some places have been scandalously stuffed against them and are prepared to furnish proof. We hope this will be forthcoming in such bold characters that he that runs may read.

—Mr. W. L. MacKenzie King, Deputy Minister of Labor seems to be the right man in the right place. His recent mission to England to discuss with the Imperial authorities the question of Hindu immigration has resulted in action that will prevent a swamping of British Columbia by our dear dark fellow citizens of Empire, in India. Meanwhile strikes in Montreal, Owen Sound and other places show need for a Labor conciliator at home. Crowds of immigrants may make the strikers sorry.

Rev. D. C. Hossack on Whitney Role.

To the Editor of The Globe.

Rather more than three years ago, when the last Provincial campaign was in progress, I addressed through the press some remarks to the independent electors. It is gratifying to think that in the interval the number of independents has increased. The tide is running that way. It means better days to come. We are now in the midst of another campaign, and it may be well to inquire, after reviewing recent events, what is the duty of independent electors at the present time? I have received inquiries from some Liberals who were not in accord with my opinions in 1905 as to my present views, and it has been suggested by some of them, and also by others who agreed with me on that occasion, that the present juncture was of such importance that if I had well-defined views upon public affairs I should not hide them. Under these circumstances, and as public discussions safeguard civil liberty and makes for good government, I offer no apology for reviewing recent events. My humble opinions, if not accepted, may incite a fuller consideration and so lead to a wise conclusion.

A Call to the Independent.

On November 14, 1904, Mr. Whitney called a conference to be held in Toronto on November 24th. The invitation was general. He said: "In addition, I invite representative men in each constituency, no matter what their party affiliations may be, and who sympathize with our objects, to attend and help us by their advice and encouragement. In the present of great public peril, party designations and differences are of secondary importance." Mr. Whitney publicly sought Liberal assistance. It was his privilege to do so. No one complained. But it is not forgotten that he did it.

During the campaign Mr. Whitney strenuously urged Liberals to support him. Independence of thought and action he urged at every meeting. At Brampton, Ottawa, Barrie, Ingersoll and many other places he denounced party prejudice. He spoke of the splendid record of the Liberal party in securing responsible government, of the glorious days of Baldwin and Lafontaine, and urged Liberals to rise superior to party prejudice. The Mail and Empire in its account of the Ottawa meeting reports a portion of Mr. Whitney's speech as
