Four Months' Obstruction.

For at least four months, the Opposition at Ottawa have monopolized the time of the House, and a greater part of the time their tactics have been nothing less than obstruction, pure and simple. Long debates have succeeded each other with great regularity upon matters no interest whatever to the people of the country. Scandal after scandal, so called, have taded away when confronted with the evidence, until nothing remained but the shadow. The Opposition have failed to fasten one solitary act of wrong-doing upon the Government. Scores of men have been hauled before committees of the House, volumes of evidence have been taken and the result so far this session has been an absolute blank.

This probably accounts for the present attitude of the Conservatives. Knowing that a general election is not far distant, and realizing that they cannot go before the people with any proved scandals, and knowing well that they have nothing to offer better than the policy of the Liberal Government, they seize on an imaginary grievance with regard to the amendments to the Election act, and they try to embarrass the Government by blocking supplies until the measure is withdrawn or changed to suit their views.

If the Conservatives had any policy to present, or if they could suggest any reasonable objection to the Liberal policy with which the people appear so well satisfied, and under which they have prospered for twelve years, then there would be some reasonable excuse to offer for blocking the business of the country, but none of these reasons can be urged. The Conservatives have no scandals and no policy.

—Gen. Buller died last week. While in command of the British Army in South Africa, he lost prestige and was succeeded by Lord Roberts.

—The seven Conservative members elected by acclamation on Nomination were: W. J. Paul of Addington, C. R. McKeown of Dufferin, Col. Matheson of South Lanark, A. A. Mahaffy of Muskoke, Alexander Ferguson of Simcoe, J. H. Carnegie of East Victoria, and Mr. Preston in East Durham.

THE SITUATION AT OTTAWA.—Little real business was done at Ottawa last week. An attack was made upon Sir Frederick Borden in connection with a subsidy granted to a cold storage company at St. John in which the Minister of Militia was said to be interested, a statement which Sir Frederick emphatically denied. Apart from this, the Opposition policy of obstruction was continued and was only relaxed enough to allow the passage of an item providing for salaries to customs officials. The occasion of conflict is still the elections bill. It has become quite plain that the ground of difference between the parties is not serious enough to justify the waste of time and the useless expense entailed upon the country by the proceedings of the past few weeks. At present the Manitoba voters' lists are prepared by registration clerks appointed by the Manitoba Government, and provision is made for revision before the judges. The Conservative contention is that the lists so prepared should be accepted and used for the Dominion elections. The Dominion Government's bill provides for a special revision on the eve of the Dominion elections by which the voters shall be assigned to their proper constituencies and names added or taken off as may be shown to be right. It was at first proposed that this revision should be carried out by officials appointed by the Dominion Government. Since then, Sir Wilfrid Laurier has offered as compromise to leave the entire revision to the judges. It is a shocking commentary upon the state of political morality in Canada, that the real difficulty in the way of effecting a settlement is the suspicion that neither party can be trusted to effect a fair and honest revision.—Presbyterian.

—Dreyfus, the Frenchman who was degraded from the army and afterwards reinstated as a hero was shot at by an assassin while attending a great public function in honor of the late Emile Zola, who was the means of arousing the French nation to do him tardy justice. The bullet entered his wrist and the assassin has been captured.
