It is an emphatic verdict of the course pursued by the Government in the interests of the constituents and a decided rebuff to the Proy. Premier Scott has made an emphatic denial of the statements that Sir Wilfred Laurier had anything to do with bringing on the elections or taken part in them. Re Separate Schools.

By the retention of these schools in the Constitution of the new provinces, the Liberal party was consistent with its record as the provincial rights party, for it retained only what the territory had framed for itself many years before.
