"At 3.30 Tuesday morning we sighted Lake Erie, passed a lighthouse, but got no answer to our call. This travelling by night was between 2,000 and 2,000 feet and when the boys learned they were over the take they began to talk of danger. Previous to this they showed remarkable bravery. I quieted them by saying we were well prepared to sail over it. But we failed to get across because of troublesome air currents and we were driven back to land in a half circle. At 7.30 yesterday morning, when the sun expanded the gas we arose to an altitude of 12,000 feet and at once struck a good current. From 7,30 to 12 o'clock we were right over the water and out of sight of land, but shortly after noon when at an altitude of 16,000 feet we sighted the Canadian shore. The boys were very sick. Perry, who is 16 years old, grabbed his life preserver. They implored me to land, and I tried hard to do it. I opened the valve and in a little over two minutes dropped 10,000 feet. This terrific descent frightened the boys, but I tried to calm them. As I was striking for land, I ran into a cross air current and was carried back over the lake. In our speedy descent I had to throw out ballast to check the
