Mr. Ball in his speeches had been advocating "reasonable protection" to industries, and he took issue with him on this question so vitally interesting to the farmers and large consumers of classes. On the authority of three eminent managers, two of them Conservative, a higher tariff was unnecessary. It was owing to LaSalle and other tariff lines that manufacturers, including Mr. Ball, had had the best time of their lives. His impression was abroad that a bonus was paid on all immigrants, but this was wrong as only about 10 per cent was bonused.

Referring to the salary of the salary Grab, he said he felt quite competent to defend himself and Mr. Ball and the Chronicle need have no fear of the voters' verdict. He pointed out, what he thought Mr. Ball did not know, that there was no mileage allowance now, for every day absent from the riding was a dollar, and the whole total increase to the country was not much greater. But "if we were all sinners, what about Mr. Borden who accepted not only the salary, but a salary of \$7000 as well." The average cost to the farmers of South Grey of this increase was only 3 cts a year.

After a magnificent justification of his attitude on the School question he referred to the cowardly and mean insinuation contained in the Chronicle, that he had altered his speech before it was issued in Hanover. He generously thought Mr. Irwin could not have been the author, but that the gentleman was present and admitted the authorship. Mr. Miller amid applause offered him \$1000 if he could prove from the Chronicle that he had ever used the term "yellow dogs" in the way he had insinuated, or any other opprobrious expression in connection with Catholics or any class in the community.

Mr. Miller riddled Mr. Ball's claim to independence by his association with the help he was receiving from the leader of his party and numerous associates.

Space will not permit us to do more than mention his clear explanations of the Sack, Valley Land Co., the Blairmore Site, and many other so-called scandals. He closed this part of his great applause by declaring that neither Mr. Borden nor any other man ever got a hint or a favor except he was the highest bidder.

He had warm words for the personal character of Sir Wilfrid admitted there had been dishonesty in officials who were appointees of the late Conservative government. He said that the government could not have done more than it had done to clean up the Civil Service Commission of men not of its own party, and then later by appointing Judge Cassels to investigate the former's staunch Conservative.

R. J. BALL
After a personal reference to his work he sat down amid long continuing applause and a hard-shelled story he told of his own life. He admitted that the brilliant speech, devoid of all bitterness, was the utterance of a man who had done his duty and done it well.

Mr. Ball was also very heartily received and was glad to see Mr. Miller so buoyant. He expressed the pleasure it had given him to go over the riding as their Warden, and now in this campaign and the double experience had given him ample opportunity to discover the needs of the people.

He claimed a measure of independence, party politics had been unreasonably partisan, and he came before them a staunch Conservative "as far as right principles went." He complimented Mr. Miller on being a far-sighted man, but accused of following his party too closely when they broke through the plank of their platform.

He disclaimed knowledge of Birmingham's object in coming here, said "he had made statements he should not have made," a remark that called forth "He did not say it" from a few in the audience, who was followed by a storm of others who protested "He did say it." He touched on Western schools, increased expenditure, (as usual omitting mention of increasing revenue), said people of this country had no business to consider how Miller ran his office, attacked middlemen, referred to Moncton and Intercolonial so-called land deals, (capable of the clearest explanation as Mr. Miller has shown) and, like Mr. Borden had a fling at the cruet and fruit stands, pickle dishes, &c., that were put on the Montcalm.

He accused Mr. Miller of being generous, (from our seat we could not see if H. H. blushed), "some people say I am tight" (and after a pause) "I try to be honest anyway."

Mr. Ball wandered over a lot of topics, plainly giving the impression that he was trying to fill in his time. In almost the same sentence he had grits had kept the old tariff and they had ruined industries by lowering it.
