



the main dining hall. Domestics-which so many people believe were very cheap in those daysenteenth century a kitchen woman was paid £3 or £4 a month, "not including wine and lard."

Gambling went on in most houses. There were games of "lansquenet" and "pharaoh" even in the salons of embassies! Servants asked their masters to stake their wages for them.
