Echoes of the Campaign.

The campaign as far as Durham was concerned ended in considerable enthusiasm. The Friday night meeting called by Mr Ball's committee ostensibly to accept Mr Miller's challenge was well attended even to the crowding of the hall. Mr Wm Laidlaw was chairman and the audience mixed, with, of course, a preponderance of Conservatives.

Mr Ball was fortified by the presence of I. B. Lucas, M. P. P., and on the request for champions of H. H. Miller's cause, Messrs Wm Calder and C. Ramage promptly responded. Mr Ball led off touching on a few controversial points, but falling back as usual on the cry of scandal and the salary grab. He was followed by Mr Ramage who corrected him at several points and presented the successful record of Laurier administration especially in the Post Office department. He dealt also with the North Atlantic Trading Co. agreement. There was manifested at first a disposition to refuse a hearing, but as he progressed there was nothing to complain of.

The brilliant Markdale lawyer followed and of course the former speaker became the target for cheap sallies in the patronizing style of the bantering lawyer to an opposing witness. His reliance on these to draw a laugh was evident, but the constant iteration "Isn't that so? Mr Ramage, "You agree so that? Mr Calder," "Don't you think so? Mr Ramage" became tiresome to his audience especially as they were followed in many cases by unblushing falsehoods. "Mr Ramage agrees to that," &c. &c. For a distinguished lawyer to take his speech largely from campaign literature was a disappointment that his antics couldn't atone for. Mr Ramage would have liked to have had a return word or two but the partisan chairman was against it. The chairman, however allowed Mr Lucas to exceed his time in spite of protests from the audience.

It had been arranged that Mr Lucas was to have 10 minutes to reply to Mr Calder, but as the lawyer sat down he said "go on Mr Calder I won't ask to reply, apparently a generous action, but interpreted by many to mean "go home now I am through." Certain it is that when Calder rose the audience was about to make for the door, but his voice and attitude restrained many of the Conservatives and most of Liberals who for about 10 or 15 minutes saw Mr Lucas made to wince from the sledge-hammer blows of the mayor. Mr Lucas had flung the tory campaign book at Mr Calder with advice to post himself from its contents. Calder kept it till on his feet and at a proper moment flung it back to him, and sent a grit one after it, and the audience cheered to the echo.

The meeting ended with a strong Miller feeling, which helped to fill the hall to overflow again on SATURDAY EVENING.

This, the last of campaign, was enthusiastically Miller. Mayor Calder was chairman and Dr Taylor and Miller speakers. The former made an excellent summary of Laurier legislation. He is a convincing speaker and was listened to closely. Mr Miller took up the "scandals" voiced the previous night and dealt with them vigorously. Referring to the bluffing bill calling him to the Friday meeting, he detailed its history as the REVIEW had it last week and said the man responsible for that bill "should get a string and play horse" or "put on potticorns and make mud pies."

Mr Miller spoke as clearly as ever, though the strenuous life, broken sleep, &c., was having its effect and he might well be tired. He ended by an appeal for every vote to be polled on the coming Monday.

Cheers for King and candidate and the last meeting of the campaign was over.
