Such a bid will compel the second bidder to make a decharation of such value that he may hesitate to offer it for fear o being told to go ahead and play it.

If his suit is clubs, for instance, he will think a long time about bidding three in clubs unless he is pretty sure he can get there, because he knows he will most likely be doubled and find several hundred points penalty piled up against him. His partner cannot come to his rescue to pull him out of the hole, if he is doubled without running the risk of getting into a still deeper hole himself.
