A Tale of the Sea.

The most thrilling tale of disaster at sea and scientific rescue that has ever been told was told last week. The Italian steamer Florida in a fog rammed the white Steamer Republic out in mid-ocean, the latter so badly that she began to sink. However she had wireless telegraph and at once sent the danger signal abroad. This was caught by no fewer than 7 vessels distant from 50 to 100 miles. Enquiry soon informed the location of the injured vessel and at once out of the darkness help rushed to the scene of the disaster. Meanwhile the Florida, injured, lit not fatally, had taken over the passengers of the Republic, and before long another steamer the Baltic came in sight and they were transferred again as being safer. The Republic, suitably sinking, efforts were made to tow her to shallow water, Captain Sealby and his first mate alone remaining on the Republic to direct operations. It would not do, down went the million dollar vessel, stern first, leaving the two brave men in the whirlpool of the sinking, struggling for life. As once boats went from the Baltic, and Captain and Mate were saved, but by a narrow margin. Small wonder that cheers and counter cheers rang out from the rescued passengers and crew, baggage and valuables all gone, but life preserved. Small wonder Captain Sealby and Binns, the telegraph operator, were carried shoulder high on reaching New York, heroes not of a day, but for many a year, an example of duty done in danger, of presence of mind, that furnishes a lesson to the world.
