The Annual meeting of the Shareholders of the National Portland Cement Co. was held last Wednesday in Toronto.

The absence of all dividends this year, the depression in the cement industry and the unsatisfactory statement issued by the company had caused all over the Province considerable dissatisfaction.

The office staff were on hand at 9 a. m. Wednesday to receive proxies for which a simple temporary receipt was given.

The discussions in the afternoon took a wide range. Mr. Wm. Williams took the chair at the opening and gave a resume of the season's operations by reading the Directors' Report.

Points objected to were reckoning as assets the "Goodwill" of \$48,000 and the "Reserve" of \$175,000.
