First National Congress.

Laymen's Missionary Movement.

Saturday, 3rd April. To-day is the last of the four-day session of the great Congress. The morning session is over, and denominational meetings of the delegates are to be held this afternoon in their various churches. To-night the last great rally will be held in Massey Hall when a program of development and further progress will be sure to be adopted. Tomorrow, the spirit of the meeting will be continued in the various churches and in Massey Hall, concluding the first National Congress of the New Movement, designed to so stimulate the Missionary spirit of the churches that the "whole world shall receive the whole gospel" in this generation. More than one of the American speakers complimented Canada on her premier position for as J. Campbell White, of New York, the General Secretary of the Laymen's Missionary Movement, said "There can never be another FIRST Congress."

The meetings have been an inspiration, a surprise to many. How could they otherwise be? The spectacle of 4000 men meeting for such a purpose, earnest men, business men, with a judicious mixture of 1500 clergymen, meeting day by day to discuss the mission of obeying the Saviour's great commission, "Go ye therefore and teach all nations," was a spectacle never to be forgotten.

Here was union. For years committees of three of the churches have been formulating a basis of union. Here were representatives of five or six churches singing the Church's one Foundation is Jesus Christ our Lord, with a fervor that sunk all denominational feeling. "One Lord, one Faith one Birth," was impressed on that great company and as all go home to form new centres of influence, who will say that the cause of union will not be immeasurably advanced.

Then the cosmopolitan character of the speakers was notable: a United States Consul, now at Halifax came to tell among other things, how in a similar situation at Singapore he had studied the work of the missionaries and became himself one of their converts and thrilled the vast audience by boldly avowing it. Here was Sir Andrew Fraser, for 37 years in the British Service in India, a Lieut. Governor of one of the Provinces, moderator of the Gen. Assembly of the Pres. Church in India, addressing himself to the thousands as a "fellow subject of the King of Kings." There was reverence and exultation, humility and pride, and many another Christian sentiment drawn upon as speaker after speaker dilated on the needs of the heathen world, the heroism of the missionaries and the difficulties they had to face.

It is impossible to summarize at this juncture, it can only be hoped that the spirit of the great meeting will expand into every hamlet in the land and produce an enthusiasm that shall take as its watchword, "Jesus shall reign where'er the sun Doth his successive journeys run."

Will he Prove a Napoleon?

A few days ago it was learned that Germany had snubbed Russia and had compelled her to take a passive attitude though all her Slav leanings prompted her to move against Austria. France dare not butt in, Italy is helpless, for the moment the Emperor is unquestioned dictator of continental Europe, and, unlike Napoleon, has become so without actual strife. He appears to be following Napoleon's tactics, getting Europe cowed before tackling Britain, if one may judge from the feverish anxiety displayed in naval construction and in promoting aerial navigation. Will Britain a second time, be as she was a century ago, the Saviour of Europe? She did it alone before; is this time there will be strong young arms to her aid if need should arise.

The land grant of 2000000 acres to the Canadian Northern Railway was carried in the local house by a majority of 52 on Tuesday. The opposition had the satisfaction of seeing several members of the government side voting with them.
