### A POLITICAL HISTORY OF SOUTH GREY

By Mr Malcolm McPhee, Nenagh. The candidates in this election (for Legislative Assembly in 1857) were: Richard Carney, in the Conservative interest; a doctor from Dundas Bay, Hamilton by name was the "clear grip" candidate and a third was John Sheridan Hogan, from Toronto, a lawyer and a kind of a free lance. Hogan was the victor. Mr McPhee went to vote for the first time at this election, but for some reason was not allowed. These were days when voters waited for neither team nor toter so "Mac" and his father trudged all the way to Neustadt, refusing a ride with a company of political opponents lest it should compromise them in the eyes of others. At this period besides the Legislative Assembly, Canada was governed by a Legislative Council, a kind of Senate, but elective, its term being 8 years. In 1856 an election was held for this body. Gray at that time was included in the "Saugeen Division," which was one of the constituencies of the present Counties of Simcoe, Grey and Bruce. Three candidates "jumped up" for the position: Hon. James Patton, Barrie; Hon John McMurrich, Merchant, Toronto; Jas. Beattie, Publisher of the "Leader and Patriot," Toronto. Beattie got a majority in the division. It was in this election or about this time, the name "clear grip" originated as applied to a political party, at least Mr McPhee first heard it at this time. Returning to the Hogan election: Hogan sat two sessions but when the third session came around his place was empty, and had to remain so, as no Hogan could be found. In the fall of 1859 his body was found in Toronto Bay, at the mouth of the Don river. Examination led to the conclusion that it had been in the bay for eighteen months. Stains were found on the railing of the bridge over the Don, these were shaved and scraped off and taken to Prof. Croft, Toronto, to be analyzed. He declared it to be human blood. At this time there existed the "Brook Bush Gang" a set of desperadoes, who caused terror in many districts. Our member it was found, had been a frequenter of the neighborhood and had met death it was learned by a man named John Browne, a handy man or man-of-all-work for Hon. John Hillyard Cameron, and also a frequenter. Browne was suspected, arrested, tried, convicted and hanged on the evidence of Jane Ward and Ellen McGilllock in spite of the strenuous legal efforts of the Hon. John, to save him. South Grey candidates and members, time and again have been killed politically: once only did one die in the flesh by violence. The county was now open and the Government seized the opportunity to place in the field for the by-
