A POLITICAL HISTORY OF SOUTH GREY

The second Dominion election in 1872 found Geo. Jackson in office and a candidate for re-election. The Reformers had now found a new man in the person of Dr Landerkin, of Hanover, who defeated the redoubtable George Jackson, after being 11 years representative of part of the county.

Back to the Legislature: the first election under Oliver Mowat was in 1875 and Lander determined to stay with his lovely riding of East Grey, which had developed strong Conservative tendencies.

In 1882, another Dominion election was held, resulting again in the return of the Conservatives. The Reform party stuck to Dr Landerkin, and the contest was again between him and Mr Geo. Jackson, the former winning, and Mr Jackson now disappears from the political life of South Grey.

The election gave Hunter a substantial majority; many would have liked a celebration but the idea met with strong opposition, led by Mr Jno. McKelvey and others who denounced it as unseemly since many Conservatives voted for Hunter.

In September 1878, Mackenzie brought on a Dominion election, the great issue being shall Canada adopt a protection policy, called by the Conservatives a "National Policy," for
