



Finger-Prints Never Fall. Although sears from wounds and ul-

cers freugently partly destroy the pattern folds, such disfigurements are more often than otherwise aids to identifeation. When the system of finger prints was first introduced at police head quarters in New York, a lieutenant in one of the administrative departments. tried to discredit it.
