

Weigh and sample regularly, and make sure that each cow brings in good profit. -C. F. W.

IMPROVE SHEEP BREEDING. Eight demonstration flocks of grade sheep, bred and kept for commercial purposes, are being established at representatitve points in the Province of Ontario, one in Middlesex, one in Huron or Bruce, another in Brant, one near Toronto, one in Simcoe county, one in Victoria, and one in the neighborhood of

Kingston or east. This enterprise is undertaken at the instance of the Ontario Sheep-breeders' Association, supported by the Provincial Department of Agriculture. The Association recommended the appointment of two inspectors, John Campbell, of Woodville, and Lient.-Col. Robt. McEwen, of Byron. These two men are now, and have been, selecting the flocks with which to demonstrate, Ten or twelve good ewes are chosen in each case, and with them one ram of each of the following breeds will be respectively mated, viz., Southdown, Dorset Horned, Shropshire, Hampshire, Cotswold, Leicester, Lincoln, and Oxford. 
