Cook and Peary.

The committee of the National Geographical Society, of Washington, has decided on the evidence produced by the explorer, that Commander Robert E. Peary really did reach the North Pole on April 6th last, and have voted him a special medal in honor of the achievement. The case for Cook has not changed materially in the past few weeks. The University of Copenhagen has refused the United States Society the privilege of being present, through their representatives, at the official examination of Dr Cook's papers, the reason given being that it was not right to make any distinction in favor of any one scientific society. Apparently the National Geographical Society is very doubtful of Dr Cook. A prominent member of the Committee of Examination has publicly called him a fakir of the most barefaced type. Some of the explorer's statements do appear unable to bear very close examination, but it seems hardly just to denounce him until the fairest and fullest official examination of his claim is made. Cook did not reach the pole, and scientists should be able clearly and positively to convict him of dishonesty.
