If the health of the body is in any way dependent upon the attention which the teeth receive, or, if any of the diseases which play such havoc among mankind can be traced either directly or indirectly, to the unsanitary conditions of the mouth. that sarely, should be reason enough to convince even the most skeptical of the necessity of keeping the teeth and oral cavity in general in nealthful condition.
