A Greater Grey.

Not every one knows that a movement is under way throughout Ontario known as the "Stay-in-Ontario" movement. It has its origin in the spectacle witnessed every spring for some years back of seeing numbers of Ontario citizens leaving for the west, lured there by golden prospects of prairie products, while in many cases, the same enterprise, contentedly used at home, would produce results not imagined at the present time.

It is high time the Press, Farmers' Clubs, Granges and Farmers' Institutes and Agricultural Societies joined in this "Stay in Ontario" movement and "Stay in Grey" in particular. We believe that an organized publicity campaign could be made that would result in centring attention on our good county and by showing actual results, already obtained by our best Agriculturists open the eyes of many who have not given thought to the possibilities of intensive farming, on smaller areas than many now hold.

In grain production we cannot perhaps hope to compete with the west, but in the feeding of Stock, in Dairying, in vegetable growing, in fruit-growing, in poultry production, in bee-keeping, in sugar-making and in other lines of farm activity the County of Grey can more than hold its own.

We ask our thousands of readers to think this thing over, we are open for suggestions and our columns are open for brief articles intended to strengthen the argument to Stay in Ontario and above all to make

When the ballots were counted it was found that 136 electors had voted against the bar-room. This must have included nearly every one on the list. Against the by-law not a single ballot was cast.
