He observed eight varieties of tworowed barley to determine the ratio of rights to different varieties and of the various kernels from the same individual spikes, and found that among 12,401 seedlings 7,237, or 58.36 per cent., had the first leaf twisted to the left. A variety of millet showed an excess of lefthanded seedlings, as was also the case with oats. In the case of corn the ratio was almost unity, and there was apparently "no inheritance of right and left-handedness is such."




