Wide Awake China.

Few things in the Mission or Christian World have caused such a sensation as has the appeal of China about two weeks ago. The appeal was made by the Chinese government to all the Christian churches in China to set aside April 27 as a day for prayer that China might be guided to a wise solution of the critical problems besetting her. This is regarded in China as striking evidence of the extraordinary changes which have taken place in the nation since the revolution. The appeal was distributed broadcast by telegraph to all the governors and high officials within whose jurisdiction Christian communities were to be found. It was also sent to the leaders of the various Dispensing Chemist M missions. Prayer was requested in the appeal for the National Assembly, for the new Government, for the President of the Republic who is yet to be elected, for the constitution of the Republic, for the recognition of the Republic by the powers, for the maintenance of peace and for the election of strong and virtuous men to office.
