Bruce Drying Up

The going into effect of Local Option in Kincardine to-day and the consequent banishment of booze from the scenery there, leaves Walkerton and vicinity standing out conspicuously as the wet territory on the map of Bruce. How the county as a whole is drying up may be gathered from the fact that in 1874 there was issued in Bruce no less than 189 tavern and 29 shop licenses, as against 24 tavern and no shop licenses for 1913, the last liquor store and the station hotel being doomed to shortly vanish from the landscape here. Of the 24 licenses that will thus be issued in the county for 1913, it is probably singular that 20 of these should be granted for Walkerton and immediate vicinity, the list being as follows: Walkerton 5, Carrick 7, Brant 4, and Greenock 4. That the Bruce Capital and every township surrounding it should be wet while almost all the rest of the county is dry, reveals one of the most remarkable situations in the Province.—Bruce Herald and Times.
