ARMY'S HEAVY EXPENSE.

Each German Soldier Costs at Least \$238 to Peasant Family.

At a time when Germany is about to make a big increase in her army it is of interest to note the economic effect of the present peace footing upon a typical peasant family. This aspect of Germany's military burden has been made the subject of investigation, and from all reports on nearly 2,000 peasants' families in Bavaria it is seen that every soldier costs his family at least \$238 during the two years of

service in the army. As the pay of the men does not suffice for their needs, their parents have to send them money and gifts that average about \$36 a year. Besides this, the peasant must hire a farm laborer as a substitute for sis son, which means a further expense of \$90. These figures appear all the more serious when it is remembered that over half of the families included in the investigation furnished the country at least four soldiers each, while the num-

ber went as high as eight or nine in some families. A striking feature of the situation is the virtual ruin of some small farms by the removal of the young men to do their term of service. Such cases are by no means rare. 
