

Less than two months after the creature had she expected to see? overturning of the monarchy, the divorce laws, which before had withheld from women the right to petition for dissolution of marriage under any circumstances, were so amended that they now enjoy equal privilege in the courts with men.

A little later a law was passed, similar to the new French law, holding the fathers of illegitimate children responsible for their support, as well as for the support of the mothers. The marriage laws also were reformed, one phrase of especial significance being incorporated, that "conjugal society is based on the freedom and equality of both parties."

The wife's freedom is safeguarded in many ways; for instance, the husband may not take his wife into another country to live without her consent. Women may now pubish their own manuscripts without their husband's consent, which was forbidden under the old regime, and both wives and husbands may now sue third parties in the courts without each other's permission.


