Chicken Livers .- Wash well to

remove all blood, have latter well heated in a skillet, drop in the livers. As soon as they touch the hot fat turn them and do this repeatedly to keep them from hardening on the outside. The secret of good frying lies in turning them often. This keeps the substance soft and juicy. When the livers are fried season them with salt and pepper and fill up the skillet with soup stock. If you like a thick gravy add a teaspoon of flour to the butter before adding the soup Another good way to prepare the livers is to stick a clove into each one, sprinkle ground cinnamon and sugar over them and fry in sweet butter. These do not need soup stock, and are served on toast for those who have a sweet tooth.


