The Library Institute

Successful and Profitable Sessions.

The fifth Annual Meeting of the Orangeville District Library has passed into history, having been held in such agreeable surroundings. At the meeting in London last year, Rev. Dr. Farquhar was honored with the chair and it was a distinct pleasure to be able to preside at the session.

The C. P. R. noon train brought many delegates, the G. T. R. as well as those from other districts. They came and after dinner they spent the afternoon in getting acquainted in inspecting the fine building and grounds. Admiration was expressed for the bright interior, though many noted a slight architectural mistake of it being too low.

The President called the meeting to order about 3 p. m. and after calling Secretary Ramage to the address of welcome, reading historical remarks of the growth of the Library.

Delegates in attendance were: Orangeville—D. McPherson, Grand Valley—Jas. McKinley, Hanover—Mrs. Wisler, and R. Yeager, Honeywood—Mrs. G. East, Mono Centre—A. McFadden, Badjeros—W. H. Crossley, Mono Mills—Rev. John A. Blaine, Claude—John H. Marshall, Kemble—Jas. Gardiner, Bolton—Miss Clifton, Brampton—Miss H. E. Hart, Durham—C. Elvidge, Shelburne—James Cameron, Balfour—Jas. McDonald, Caledon East—W. J. Atkin, Miss Vogan, Orangeville—Alex. Firth, Bolton—Mrs. D. P. Coleridge, Owen Sound—Miss V. Scott, Lake Charles—Jos. Davidson.

After nominating and electing committees had been appointed, the chairman gave his opening address which he referred to the district officers, his predecessor, and the Library as an educational center and as an aid to the church. It had a mission and comfort and gave to those that used its privileges, new ideas. We never know the price less we know the past and the future. We should keep the library in our minds.

The "Instruction Hour" by Spereaman, of Toronto, was the title. She is the official of the Education Department, and than any other one person touch with social libraries of the province. Her address was an explanation of the department of classification which is being adopted in Ontario, which is certainly worth in such a library as Durham. She let fall many hints that of value to all libraries.

There are 450 libraries and the Department at its expense sends Miss Spereaman to assist in creating libraries. Following this came reports in writing from the libraries by the delegates amongst the points brought up by the delegates.

Rural mail delivery by use of daily papers was discussed. Also the multiplicity of libraries acted in the same district with 845 members. Brampton is the largest city in the province, and gets a municipal grant of \$250 from the department. Delegates were wishing council had been a success.

Where libraries can be new books, the department circulating libraries to the interest. Grand Valley has both grant and a village grant of \$6000. Some libraries have been in connection with concerts they hold.

Orangeville is the largest town in the district with 845 members. The department council is costing \$450 for their list and is generous in its institution which has new books.

Hanover is the most interesting. Mrs. Lester could not attend. Her principal interest was in the library. She has instituted "Hour" and with volunteer talks are given to the district study at these at the Kindergarten.
