UNIQUE POW-WOW. Manitoba Indians Pass Resolution To Guard Against Fire.

Probably nowhere else in Canada is there a stronger co-operative spirit in forest fire protection than has been developed by the Chief Fire Ranger of the Dominion Government among the rangers, Indians, trappers and packers of the Northern Manitoba Fire District, says a Forestry branch press bulletin. The work among the Indians has been especially beneficial, for in the past they were notoriously careless, especially in leaving camp-fires burning. But, largely owing to the energy and initiative of the Chief Ranger, the attitude of the Indians has been changed from one of indifference to one of keen interest, so much so, that official writes: "The conservation of the forests has become as red-hot a topic out here as real estate in the West."

Recently, when treaty-money was being paid to the Indians at Cross Lake, a special council meeting of seventy-five to eighty Indians was called, at which an animated discussion of forest fire protection took place. The Chief Ranger writes: "While the meeting was in progress, the Indian Agent and party came, but to the surprise of many the meeting held no interest till, by a standing vote, all asserted their willingness to help in the protection of the forests from fire. The chief and councillors wished me to convey to the Director of Forestry at Ottawa this, their resolution. Whenever possible such councils are attended by the Chief Ranger, and all Indians promising to cooperate with the Dominion rangers are presented with a metal badge of office. The most intelligent of the Indians are engaged as regular fire-rangers by the Dominion Government and do very conscientious work. Although the patrol is difficult, being done wholly by canoe, and the weather is often inclement, the eighteen fire-rangers in this district average about eight or ten miles a day, including Sundays, throughout the summer. During the whole season, no serious damage was done by fire although many incipient forest fires were extinguished, a fact that speaks well for the efficiency of the patrol and the value of the co-operative spirit inculcated in the Indians."

Before water clocks were invented in 158 B.C., time was called at Rome by public criers. In England the measurement of time was, in early days, uncertain; one expedient was by wax candles, three inches burning an hour and six wax candles burning twenty-four hours—asccribed to Alfred, 836.

RUCKEL'S ADVENTURE. Swedish Naturalists Have An Exciting Adventure in Patagonia.

This highly exciting accident happened to a party of Swedish naturalists who were exploring the little-known regions of Patagonia. Mr. Carl Skottberg describes the adventure in "The Wilds of Patagonia." At random we cut across a plateau to reach the river. Arrived at the edge of the canon, we saw the river whirling along 450 feet below. How were we to get down? Nowhere could we see a passage; everywhere the barranca fell away almost vertically. Just below our feet, however, there was a sandy slope with some bushes, which fell off at an angle of forty-five degrees; what came below that we could not see. remained behind to look for Ruckel, on whose back were tent and provisions. Ruckel had refused to disappear with the other horses, and had come in the bushes to find his own private way down. Two of the men climbed up to see what was going forward; and since I found waiting tiresome, I tied the horses and climbed up the ravine wall. I could see nothing, so I climbed down again, and walked along the foot of the wall, when a dreadful sight suddenly met my eyes. Half-way up the wall, at the end of a small ravine that ended abruptly, stood Ruckel, with his load hanging loose, and his legs entangled in the ropes. He was trembling from head to foot, and there seemed the slightest chance of getting him up or down, to right or left. Above him on the slope were my comrades. The unfortunate horse had fallen, tumbled down the slope sideways, and all rolled about ninety feet. He was lucky enough to recover his foothold at the very last moment; another inch, and he would have been dashed to pieces. The small space on which Ruckel stood sloped downward; at any moment his strength might give out, and he fell, he would doubt be instantly killed. I climbed up till I stood under him; the others cut the ropes and lowered the baggage to me. As far as I could see, Ruckel was not much injured, so of course we wanted to save him. Just below him to the left there was a small ridge; if we could get him safely across it, a small ravine led downward from it. Lying on his stomach, and clinging to the projections on the rock, Pagels dug some steps in the sandstone with my sheath knife, while Ruckel looked at him as immovable as the Sphinx. Then Pagels crept down, and tugged at the halter. I hardly knew what happened; there was some scrambling, half in the air, half on the rock; for a moment Ruckel lay floundering and kicking, with his belly across the ridge; then he was dragged into the ravine and saved. SHORTER DAYS IN LONG AGO. Contained Only Ten Hours 56,000,000 Years Back.

In a lecture at the Royal Academy in London recently on the movement of the stars, Professor H. H. Turner stated that 46,000,000 years ago there were but sixteen hours to a day, and twenty-nine days to a month. Some 10,000,000 years before that the day was ten hours long, and going back still further into the recesses of time, it was reduced to one hour. That, explained Prof. Turner, according to The London Chronicle, was when the earth and moon were close together—when they had recently parted company, in fact, and had started on their career as separate bodies. The principle, said Prof. Turner, applied to a very large class of bodies in the sidereal system—the double stars, astronomers knew two stars in the sky so close together that it never had been possible to separate one from another, even through the best telescopes, though it was known that one of them was very considerably brighter than the other, and it was supposed that one was describing an orbit around the other. At the other end of the scale there were some stars that had not completed their orbit in the century since they were described by Herschel. Some of them might occupy 800 or 300 years, and there were even instances in which the orbit would occupy thousands of years. The cause of the changes in the length of our day, said Professor Turner, was the effect of the tides on the earth's rotation. The moon raised two tides—one side because she pulled away the water from the earth, on the other because she pulled away the earth from the water.
