FROM MERRY OLD ENGLAND

NEWS BY MAIL ABOUT JOHN BULL AND HIS PEOPLE.

Occurrences in The Land That Reigns Supreme in the Commercial World.

Some 9,700 fewer persons were sent to prison last year than in the preceding twelve months. An anonymous donor has given £10,000 to Leeds University for the creation of a School of Agriculture. The will of Walter Whitehead, of Colwyn Bay, formerly of Manchester, surgeon, has been proved at £176,892 net. An Ulster athletic club is to be started in Birmingham to prepare young men for any emergency which may arise in Ulster.

A new company has been formed to connect North and South Shields by tunnel through which an electric railway will run.

General Sir James MacLeod Fraser-Tyler, G.C.B., who has just celebrated his 92nd birthday, is probably the oldest Indian Mutiny officer alive.

Last year there were 1,061 cremations in the United Kingdom, the largest number recorded since cremation was introduced into the country in 1885.

In London a motor bus proprietor has to comply with between fifty and sixty conditions before he can obtain a license to use it for public purposes.

Instead of running a new locomotive under its own steam to an exhibition in London an English rail-

way built a low car especially to transport it.

There are two officers still surviving who rode in the famous Malacava charge—Major Edward Phillips, 8th Hussars, and Captain Percy Smith, 13th Light Dragoons.

The British Museum has book written on bricks, tiles, oyster shells, bones and flat stones, together with manuscripts on bark, ivory, leather, parchment, papyrus, lead, iron, copper and wood.

The new Temperance Act is to some extent a safeguard for the publican. Persons who have had more than sufficient liquor are no longer at liberty to walk in licensed premises and demand more.

A familiar figure in the Bucksburn and Bankhead district has been removed by the death of Mr. John Paterson, Craig House, Bucksburn, at the advanced age of 85 years. Mr. Paterson was a native of Aberdeen.

For the first time in the history of England a colored man has been elected the mayor of a borough. John Richard Archer, whose father was born in the West Indies, has been elected Mayor of Battersea by a majority of 1 vote.

Damage to the extent of over £50,000 has been done by fire at the premises at 33 and 35 Endell Street, Long Acre, W.C., of the British and Colonial Kinematograph Co., Ltd. The warehouse was gutted and some valuable films were destroyed.

Alfred Russel Wallace, who worked out the scientific theory of evolution by natural selection contemporaneously with Darwin and independently, and then generously yielded the palm of discovery to his brother scientist, died recently in his home in Dorset, in his 91st year.

At Perran Port, a little village on the coast of Cornwall, near Newquay, there is a rude little stone oratory, measuring 25 feet by 12½ feet, known as the Oratory of St. Piran, who was sent to England by St. Patrick in the fifth century. The church, after having been buried in the sand for 1,000 years, was eventually discovered in 1835, and is probably the earliest structure in England.

Perran Round, close at hand, is a circular structure or amphitheatre, comprising an area of 130 feet in diameter, with seven rows of seats that could seat 2,000 persons. History relates that miracle plays were performed here at various times.

SPIDER-SILK.

Especially Suitable For the Nets That Enclose Balloons.

The silkworm is by no means the only creature that produces silk. Spiders make their webs, nests, and egg-cocoons of a kind of silk that is well adapted for certain of man's uses. The filaments of spider-silk are much finer than those produced by the silkworm, but they are relatively stronger. The webs of some of the large spiders of tropical countries are strong enough to entangle small birds.

As early as the seventeenth century, travellers in Paraguay found that the natives made clothing from the webs of a species of *Epeira*, the genus to which the common garden spider belongs. Spider-silk has been used for centuries in China, India, and West Africa; notably in the Chinese province of Yunnan, where the so-called "silk of the Eastern Sea" is produced.

In the year 1708 a French jurist, Monsieur Guenard of Montpellier, succeeded in making several pairs of gloves and stockings from the silk of garden spiders. The first really practical experiments, however, were made by an Englishman named Rolt. By his process, he drew the silk directly from the body of the spider; and the material he obtained was much stronger than that spun under normal conditions.

The end of the filament he attached to a bobbin, which was revolved by steam. The process does not seem to be incommode to the spider. After she has been robbed of all her silk, she rests for ten days, and is then ready to yield another supply.

As the silk comes from the spinnerets it is covered with a viscous substance, which is washed off in running water. The filaments are very fine; from eight to twenty-four must be combined to form a single thread. The fabric that is thus produced is much lighter than ordinary silk. For that reason, cords of spider-silk are especially suitable for the nets that enclose balloons.

At present the most promising experiments in the production of spider-silk are carried on in Madagascar. They use a large spider eight cents a hundred for the spiders, each of which yields a filament of 1,000 to 1,300 feet long. The silk is of a superb glossy yellow, but its color is not permanent.

THROUGH QUICKSAND.

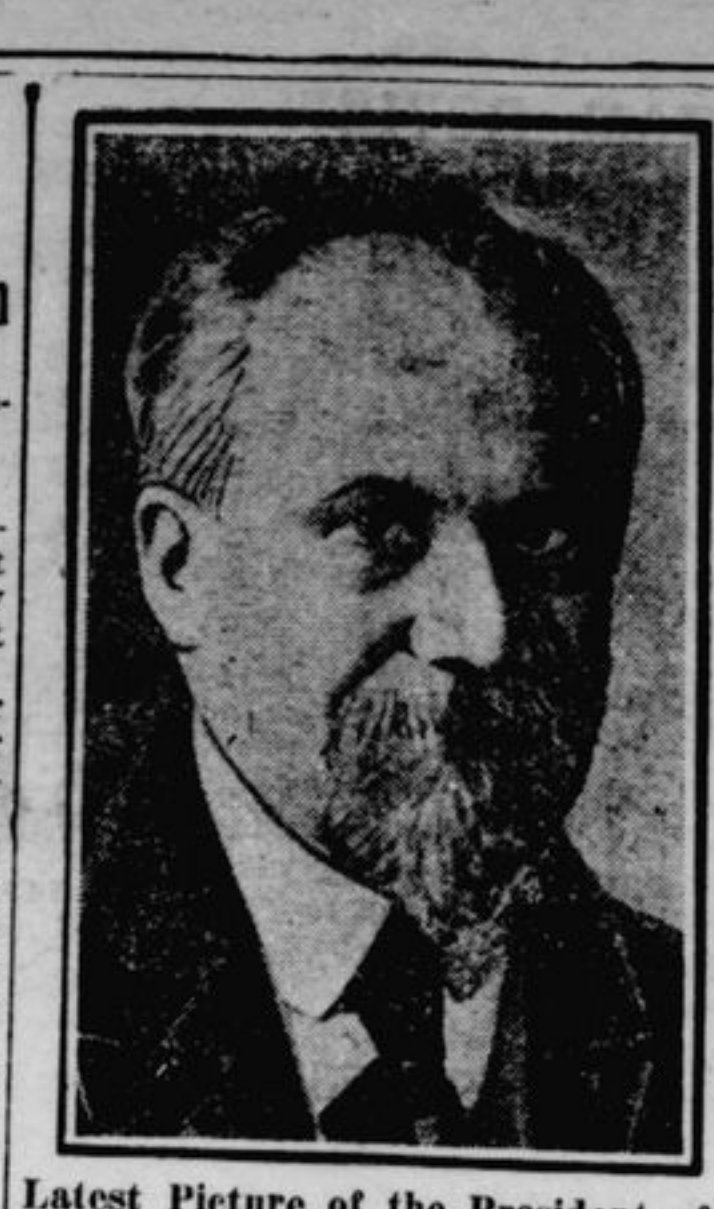
A Party of Men Had a Terrible Experience.
