AND WHEREAS the amount of the whole rateable property of the Town of Durham, according to the last revised assessment roll thereof is the sum of \$587,000:

AND WHEREAS the amount of the existing debenture debt of the said Municipality, exclusive of local improvement debt secured by special rates or assessments, is the sum of \$44,636.60 whereof no part of the principal or interest is in arrear:

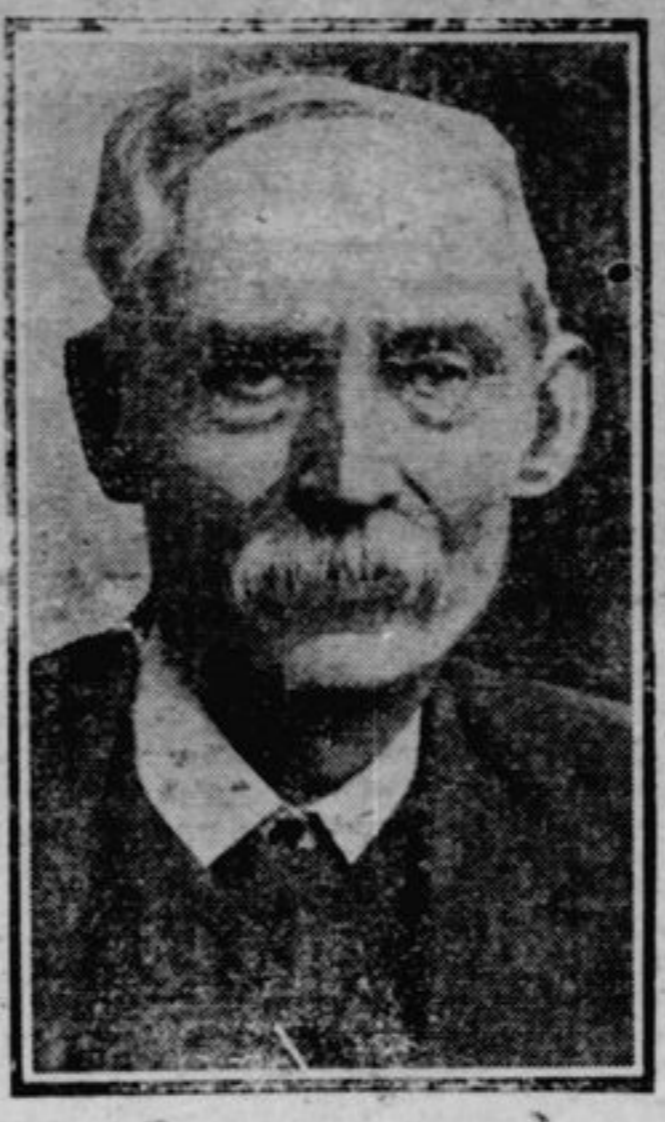
