

FASTNESS OF FOOLS.

The Shape of the Nose Does Not Count for Much.

Some crack-brain classifiers of humanity have turned their attention lately to the shape of people's noses. It is the nose, we are told now, that makes, or at least, reveals, the man.

A Roman nose means aggressive, courage, executive ability. It belongs to great warriors and captains of industry. The Grecian nose indicates refinement, often accompanied by timidity. The snub nose denotes a childlike, undeveloped type of mind. And so on, as long as white paper and printer's ink can induce the strain of chronicling such imbecilities.

Perhaps there is an element of truth in these conjectures, but it is terribly small. Alexander the Great was a warrior of some repute, whom no one has accused of timidity, and few have charged with refinement. His nose, like his blood, was pure Greek. Socrates had a snub nose of pronounced type, but his heroic life of 70 years shows no childish quality, unless it be the business of speech. The nose and ambitions of Louis XIV. were Roman, but he was physically a coward, and his executive ability consisted in cementing a despotism that had to be wrecked before his country could resume its progress.

These are individuals. Masses show the same disregard for ready-made rules. Considering their numbers, the Scandinavians of the Middle Ages were the greatest conquerors the world has known and Roman noses are as scarce in Scandinavia as black hair. The Japanese are predominantly snub nosed, but he who takes them for children has queer notions of a nursery. The Spartans were Greeks and presumably Greek nosed; but their name is a synonym for dauntless courage and their refinement was a minus quality.

There is a deal of human nature in any man, no matter what the shape of his nose; and the most unalterable thing about human nature is its variability. The effort to make fixed and certain rules for the judging of mankind is the pastime of fools.

BRITISH LABORER'S LOT.

One Found It Hard to Support Nine on \$2.5 a Week.

The lot of the rural worker under the present wage rate was emphasized at an inquest at West Worlington, North Devon, on the five-year-old daughter of William Payne, a farm laborer, says Reynolds' Newspaper. The mother stated that the child had been delicate almost from birth. She did everything possible for her family, but she found it hard to maintain a family of seven children on her husband's wages of 11s. 8d. (82.80) per week.

The father gave similar evidence, and admitted that the bedding was insufficient. He did not know how he was going to get more. It transpired that when the sheets were being washed there was only one old patchwork quilt left on the beds, and some of the children were without coats.

Dr. Brown said the child was so emaciated that it only weighed 23 pounds, death being due to pneumonia and tubercular disease. The doctor thought it impossible for the mother to do more with her husband's wages. The coroner agreed, and said it was a wonder there was a single child of the family living.

The verdict was "natural causes," and the jury, doctor and coroner, all voted suits for the relief of the family.

ELECTRIC COOKING.

Its Development Is Proceeding by Leaps and Bounds.

The deficiency in the supply of domestic servants constitutes an everyday problem in the household, but inventive effort is endeavoring to find a remedy, says a writer in Chambers' Journal. The perfection of the electrically driven, light, and expensive vacuum cleaner may cause the unhygienic broom in the collection of dust; while the perfection of the electric cooker is overcoming difficulty in the kitchen. At the present moment electric cooking is in its infancy, but its development is proceeding by leaps and bounds; and with it cooking operations are rendered easier, simpler, cleaner, and more economical than with gas or coal fires. The manipulation of the stove is mastered within a short time, joints and poultry are little during the process, and are better cooked, as well as more tasty and nutritious. Moreover, the operation is much cleaner, healthier and cooler to conduct. In London and in the provincial centres the electric restaurant is in evidence; while many large establishments, such as schools and other institutions, have adopted the electric cooker. At present the great handicap is the relatively high cost of electric current, combined with the fact that the hiring of electric stoves upon the same principle as gas stoves has not been arranged. Notwithstanding these disadvantages, however, it has been found from experience that in London the average cost of cooking by this means in a household of five persons does not exceed fivepence per day. Although current for cooking purposes is supplied at a lower rate than for lighting, the cost per unit must be reduced considerably before electricity can be considered a rival to gas for cooking, inasmuch as the average housewife regards the matter purely from the financial standpoint, and ignores the other advantages which really counterbalance the difference in the cost of the source of heat. Electricity has already appeared upon the table, where the water may be boiled for the tea, coffee, or cocoa, while the table-top is another inexpensive item which is meeting with great success. There is no denying the fact that electricity in its domestic applications will help to solve the servant problem, because nothing simpler can be conceived than the movement of a switch to do this or that, while the degree of heat can be controlled to a nicety. Moreover, by means of electric cooking becomes a pleasure.

ENGLAND'S OLDEST ISLAND.

Inhabited by Thirty-five Men, Women and Children.

There is an English parish, only forty-eight miles from London, where roads, shops, lamps, telephones, motor-cars and post-offices are unknown. It is Embley, and it is an island. The island has an area of two thousand acres, and is the property of Oxford University.

Some time ago the island was the home of thirty-five men, women and children. The inhabitants are mostly "lookers" or shepherds of large flocks of sheep. The oldest man of the village is in his seventieth year. He has never seen a motor-car.

The school and church are the two chief landmarks on the island. The reason they were built in such a sparsely populated spot is that in winter it is almost impossible to leave the island. The mud is literally knee-deep, and the ferry that runs to and from the island is dangerous. A novel method of obtaining the services of the ferrymen, who live opposite the island, is by opening the white door of a hut facing the shore. The ferrymen on the look-out know that the open door is a signal for the ferry. At night a lighted candle held aloft serves the purpose of the open door.

HALF MILLION YEARS AGO.

Questions Raised by Finding Ancient Skull in England.

Among anthropologists and others who are more interested in where man came from than "where he is going to a spirited controversy has arisen over the question whether the fossil skull discovered some time ago in England belonged to a manlike ape or to an ape-like man. Gorilla teeth fit into the skull fairly well; therefore its possessor was a monkey. But human teeth also fit; therefore the original owner of the skull was a man.

Some experts insist that he was a very intelligent ape, others that he was a man of low intelligence, and speechless. But all agree that he must have lived at least 500,000 years ago. Unfortunately all the teeth are missing except two, and these have no marks of dentistry. This adds to the difficulty of the problem.

But the date, 500,000 B.C., is interesting. It is reckoned on the basis of the time required for cave lime deposits to form, if—end the "if" looks like a big one—"if" they accumulated at the present rate of growth of stalagmites."

The date is hardly more plausible or convincing than the one given by an expert of an entirely different school, who fixed the time of the creation of man at 4004 B.C., September 23, at half-past nine in the morning, Eastern time.

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ROSES ARE POISONOUS.

The Violet, Also, Is by No Means Safe For Very Many.

The rose, that queen of flowers, is deadly. You do not believe it? Yet it is so. Giddiness and vertigo after inhaling the perfume of roses is by no means uncommon, and sometimes a peculiar form of madness is set up by an individual being shut up for a period in a room where a large number of vases holding roses are set out.

The violet, another grand flower, is by no means safe for very many. It has a most distressing effect on the vocal chords of some, and renders many people quite husky if they inhale the perfume too long. The lily is a really dangerous flower, and before now a person has died as a result of sleeping in a room where many lily blooms were set out in glasses.

It is always risky to go to sleep in a room where plants in bloom are about—you never know just what effect the perfumes may have on your constitution. And it must be remembered that the odor of flowers is much more pronounced during the night than during the day, and any sleeper gets the benefit.

The exact result of sleeping in a room where many blooms are is this—you sleep soundly under the influence of a narcotic. Have you not felt drowsy in a room well filled with flowers? Yes, well, that was a slight case of narcotic poisoning.

A great singer will not allow a bouquet of flowers to approach too near his or her nostrils—that might be a case of courting disaster; if violets in abundance were in the bouquet the voice might be impaired for the rest of the evening.

The primula is a very favorite flower, but one variety is dangerous—the primula obconica; it is deadly to some. Some can handle the plant with safety; others, if they are scratched by the leaves, contract blood-poisoning.

Pure white flowers are usually deadly, and yellow ones are little less dangerous. The beautiful jilly of the valley is a very poisonous flower, so is the crocus, so also is the buttercup—observe how grazing animals avoid the latter. The acornite is deadly, so is the foxglove, and as for the laburnum—why, it is a menace to young children.
