



PASSING OF THE LOCOMOTIVE Electricity and Internal Combus tion Engines Next.

What is to take the place of the steam locomotive was considered recently by F. W. Lanchester in a British association paper. After nearly a century of service with unchanged essentials, the passing of this machine seems to be near at hand, and railway development is progressing along the two distinct lines of complete electrification and the adoption of internal combustion

In the former system the prime mover is stationary, the power being transmitted to the locomotive electrically. The use of the internal combustion engine is taking two forms-that of turning the wheels directly, in the old way, and that of serving as a portable power station, generating electrical current that in turn drives electric mo tors connected with the axles.

The gasoline-electric is a mixed system between these two. A late product is the gasoline coach, capable of running seventy miles an hour, and it is hoped that in the future independent coaches may be coupled together in trains under the control of the leading coach, and then uncoupled at independent secalong the line.
