Custard .- A good way to make baked custard is to drop the yolk of an egg in a custard cup, add a big teaspoonful of sugar, two gratings of nutmeg and about five tablespoons of unskimmed milk, put the cup in hot water and bake slowly until the custard is firm-until a knife thrust in it comes out clean. Beat the white stiff, add a small tablespoonful of sugar, beat again. and pile on top of the custard, and garnish with a maraschino cherry in the centre of the meringue. Cool and serve.

White Jelly .- Put the white of an egg, a big tablespoonful of powdered gelatine, a cupful of water, two tablespoonfuls of sugar, three of lemon juice and a little stick of cinnamon in a saucepan with the rind of half a lemon. Beat with an egg beater until the mixture reaches the boiling point, pull to the side of the stove, cover and leave for 10 minutes. Strain through cheesecloth, add a third of a cupful of sherry and pour into two long-stemmed glasses or small moulds to harden.
