THE CROP IN SASKATCHEWAN

Conditions are Very Poor in Some Places, But Generally are Excellent

A despatch from Regina, Sask., says: The crop report of the Saskatchewan Department of Agriculture, based on replies received by telegraph to inquiries as to the conditions on July 11, states that conditions at the moment justify the statement that seldom has the crop within one Province shown such excellence on the one hand and such poor conditions on the other.

Conditions have been improved recently by a fairly general rain on July 11 and a considerable number of local showers. Seldom have the crops been called upon to withstand a long period of intense and continuous heat with few and local rains as have most of the crops in the western and central parts of the Province during the period from June 30 to July 14.
