Ontario's Premier Passes Away.

Friday last about noon, Sir James P. Whitney answered the great summons and has passed away. The severe illness of last winter left him a marked man and though he recovered sufficiently to appear a little in public those who knew the case were sure his life work was done some weeks ago he had a return of his illness, but was again improving, till a hemorrhage brought the end of the startling news. He had almost reached his 71st year.

He has died in harness and died victorious, with a record of provincial support enjoyed by none excepting perhaps Sir Oliver Mowat in his prime days. Sir James was certainly a leader and whoever in his cabinet might aspire to second place there never was doubt while he was around who was in first place: his plans and policy always prevailed. While thoroughly appreciative of the generous support he received, he had a brusque way with delegations that roused irritation occasionally, but were out his assertion which his friends loved to quote of being "bold enough to be honest and honest enough to be bold."

He was made leader of his party in 1896 and became Premier when his party was returned to power overwhelmingly in 1905 and ever since has had large majorities. His name in the last election counted for much and his colleagues have said of him by former associates on both sides of politics.

Sir James was a Lieutenant-Colonel of the Canadian Militia Reserve and carried a medal for activity in repelling the Fenian invasion. He was married in 1877 and besides his wife leaves one son and two daughters as chief mourners. He was Anglican in religion and frequently held high positions in his church.
